BP 5113.1

Truancy

To improve student attendance, the Superintendent or designee shall implement positive steps to identify the reasons for a student's unexcused absences and to help resolve the problems caused by truancy. Such strategies shall focus on early intervention and may include, but not be limited to, communication with parents/guardians and the use of student study teams.

In addition, the Superintendent or designee shall cooperate with other agencies within the community to meet the needs of students who have serious school attendance or behavior problems and to maintain a continuing inventory of community resources, including alternative programs.

Note: Depending on the resources available to the district and the number of truanancies committed by the student, a habitually truant student may be referred to a county or district school attendance review board (SARB) established pursuant to Education Code 48321, a truancy mediation program operated by the county's district attorney or probation officer pursuant to Education Code 48260.6, and/or a juvenile court pursuant to Education Code 48264.5. See AR 5113.1. The following optional paragraph should be revised to reflect programs available within the district or county.

Habitually truant students may be referred to a school attendance review board, a truancy mediation program operated by the county's district attorney or probation officer, and/or juvenile court in accordance with law.

***Note: Under California's welfare system (Welfare and Institutions Code 11253.5), a county CalWORKS office is required to reduce a family's welfare grant if it is determined that a child is not "regularly attending school as required." However, the law does not provide a definition of this phrase and it is unclear whether it is the responsibility of the school district or county welfare office to provide such a definition. CDE Management Bulletin 98-01 offers the opinion that a county welfare department should not determine that an eligible student is not "regularly attending school" until the district has referred the student to the SARB and the SARB has then referred the student to the district attorney pursuant to Education Code 48263. Under Education Code 48263, if the district and county have no SARB, the district may refer students to the district attorney or probation office. CSBA strongly recommends that districts work closely with county welfare officials in order to help develop a consistent policy for all students, including those impacted by welfare reform. The following optional paragraph provides one definition of

"regularly attending school" and is consistent with the CDE's legal opinion.***

For purposes of California's welfare system (CalWORKS), a student shall be determined to be regularly attending school unless he/she has been referred to the county district attorney or probation office pursuant to Education Code 48263.
