GRAVENSTEIN UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT REGULAR BOARD MEETING MINUTES

October 10, 2012

CALL TO ORDER

Pres. Horn called the meeting to order at 5:02 PM. Members Weaver, Zlotnick, Crocker, Clerk Wickland and President Horn present.

Final Change Order – Bay West Construction – Hillcrest Construction Project Mem. Crocker moved to accept the change orders, Mem. Zlotnick seconded. Mem. Weaver questioned two budget columns, one internal and one from the architect, varying. The discrepancy was explained. 5-0 yes.

Gravenstein Track Update

Doug Hilberman presented a proposed track design for the Gravenstein track. The cost estimate including hard and soft costs is \$133,088. Mr. Hilberman pointed out that many of the soft costs will be donated, totaling upward of \$16,000 in value.

Pres. Horn moved to approve this in concept and direct the Supt. to analyze what would be involved in creating this document to determine the feasibility of creating such a document, Mem. Zlotnick seconded, 5-0 yes.

Board Action Designating the General Fund Reserve

Supt. LaMarre is recommending that the board approve a 10% reserve. Mem. Crocker moved to maintain a 10% reserve in the general fund, Pres. Horn seconded. 5-0 yes.

Budget Update on charter Conversions
