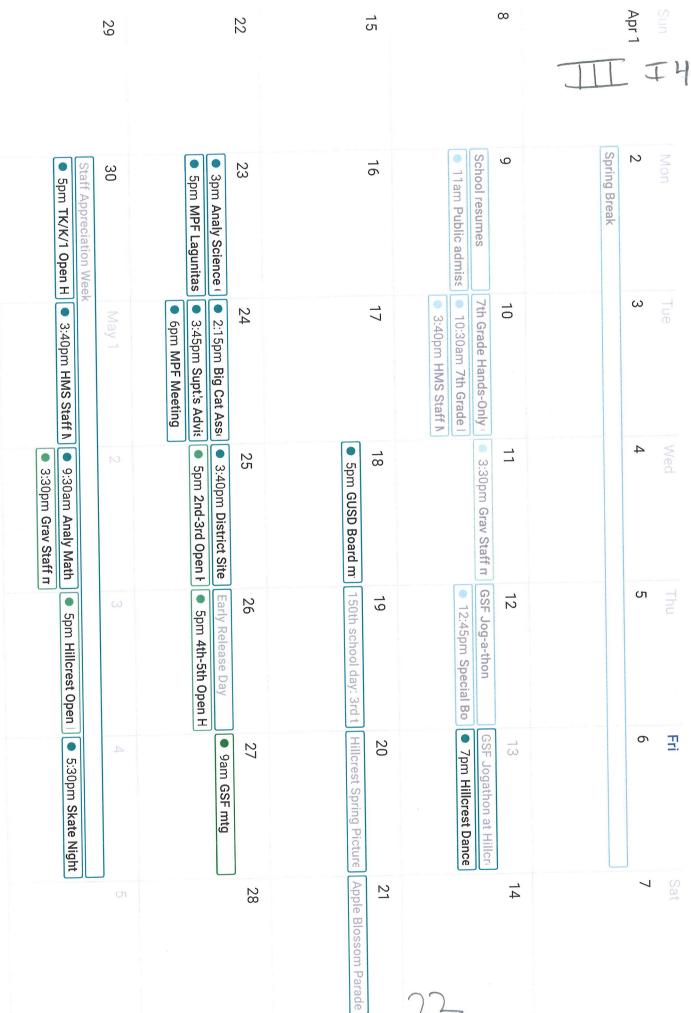

Gravenstein Union School District Window Coverings

Objectives in need for window coverings

- 1) Safety; block out view to see in event of intruder
- 2) Quick action to cover windows in an emergency situation
- 3) Blocking sunlight glare for classroom instruction
- 4) Insulation qualities for reducing heat entering into classrooms on hot days

Window Covering Options for Classrooms

Option 1 Hunter Douglas Duette ultraglide commercial ¾" fabric honeycomb opaque fabric blinds. These shades are available as Vertical pull down (Not available as horizontal pull).

Can be up to a 12' span, however not recommended (recommend two sections per window bank) See classroom 13 Gravenstein of typical classroom (rms K-18 @ Grav) Example room 13 would be 4 sections total (2 on each side) based on the objective to limit amount of time to deploy.

Hillcrest (rms 1-12) could be done as an inside mount would have four sections with the four bays of windows being the typical layout for a cleaner look. Additionally, the Hillcrest Classrooms have a large door sidelight with the doors that open up to the hallways the majority of these rooms have these sidelights covered with paper currently (would a recommend a 5th shade for these classrooms).

Modulars have less windows and would be done as one shade per window. Modulars range from having two to four windows in each classroom.

Pros:

Quick action to deploy Insulation quality for improved room comfort due to honeycomb design Better overall look

Cons:

Cost more expensive than roller shades Durability: can have issues if misused

Option 2 Roller shades

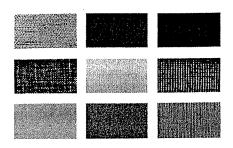

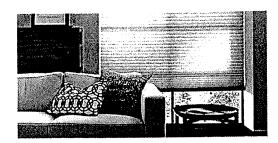

A Message from the Superintendent:

Hello GUSD Families!

We had a very successful first shelter in place drill today! Everyone did such a great job! Everywhere my team of crackerjack helpers went, they found the doors locked, and everyone was safely inside. I heard some feedback from students, who reported the

students told me it helped to experience the drill. Now they feel more confident that they know what to do, and they understand why we have shelter in place drills.

We will have one more drill this year, a shelter in place drill when the students are outside to begin. (Wed, May 2, 2018 - Time TBD)

In a shelter in place drill, where the students are outside at recess or PE, we will direct students to go to the nearest adult and follow their directions to enter a building and lock down.

The next drill will be handled in the same calm, matter of fact manner that we used today.

One more thing, in case you were at Gravenstein campus today and wondering why there were sheriff vehicles by the Gravenstein gate for a couple of hours...

It was not related to our drill. They were just investigating a death in a neighboring household. The deputies were aware that we were going to have a drill, but it was just a coincidence that they were nearby. They were not on campus for the drill, and we would <u>not</u> need to have law enforcement at future drills with students.

Of course, I will continue to work with law enforcement and benefit from their wise counsel as we continually work to improve our <u>Safety Plan</u>. I just want to assure parents that the drills we conduct are not meant to simulate the potentially scary conditions of an emergency. We are just teaching students the protocol for the different safety drills.

I hope you have a chance to ask your child how the drill went today. If you have any email.

SAFETY DRILL - APRIL 11

We have been working on updating <u>District Safety Plan</u>. Here is the final draft that Site Council completed and the GUSD Board approved recently.

I am writing today regarding the next step in our District Safety Plan – a "shelter in place drill."

We are going to have our first "shelter in place" drill on April 11 after lunch.
Gravenstein 4/11 at 1:15pm
Hillcrest 4/11 at 2:00pm

The times are staggered so Brian Sposato and I can be on each campus to lead this drill.

I have already met with our teaching staff and reviewed the basic protocol for this drill. You can also refer to the explanation below.

Teachers will review the details below with your students prior to the day of the drill, in terms that are appropriate for the developmental level of your students. We will focus on the concept of "preparation makes us feel safe" (not scared).

There are two types of drills that we need to practice. One type of drill is a "shelter in place" and one is "active danger" drill.

The difference can be described by these examples:

If someone robbed the local AM/PM market, and they haven't been caught yet. The Sheriff Dept. would call us and tell us to "lock down." That is when we do a "shelter in place."

If we are having a "shelter in place" drill or actual necessity to shelter in place, one of the administrators will come on the PA and announce a "shelter in place."

- *Staff should make sure all students are inside and and lock doors.
- *Cover windows.
- *Teachers may be allowed to continue instruction.
- *Emergency food may be eaten, and running water is available in rooms.

sneet, planket pinned up in the corner of the room to provide some privacy. (As I like to say, "this is when you find out who really needs to go to the bathroom.";-)

- *Put phones on silent. Staff should check cellphone for One Call text communication.
- *Do not exit for a pulled fire alarm.
- *You do not go outside until released via PA by administration or in person by staff or first responders at the door, using our agreed upon code.

The other type of drill is "active danger." For example, if an active shooter was on campus, or a dangerous animal. The danger is right on campus.

The codeword to signify "active danger" on campus is "CODE RED." Anyone can call a "CODE RED."

If you hear "CODE RED"...

- *Staff should make sure all students are inside and lock doors.
- *Alternatively, staff and students may run from the danger, including leaving campus. (We will teach students where to seek help if they need to leave campus.)
- *Cover windows quickly.
- *Everyone should be still and quiet, hide.
- *Put phones on silent. Staff should check cellphone for One Call text communication.
- *Barricade doors with furniture. Move/tip furniture to create shelter.
- *Do not exit for a pulled fire alarm.
- *You do not go outside until released via PA/speaker by administration or in person by first responders at the door, using our agreed upon code.

I am informing parents in advance of our drill so you have time to read over the Safety Plan; discuss safety matters with your child; and reach out to your child's teacher or me if you have any questions or concerns about our up-coming drill.

B. Approval of Second Interim Budget Report

CBO Wanda Holden reviewed the Report and showed that the Recommended certification is positive, deficit spending is projected but reserves are still adequate, and enrollment projections are constant.

Pres. Horn inquired about the historical ADA to enrollment ratio declining.

There will be \$295 per ADA of one time money in 2018-19. In future years, estimated COLA increases are 3% per year.

2015-16 basic aid supplemental (BAS) is being included in the budget to show the ability to fund enrichment programs in 2018-19 & 2019-20 in the event that donations from parent foundations decline. These funds are now being included in the budget to demonstrate the District's ability to ensure program stability with District funds.

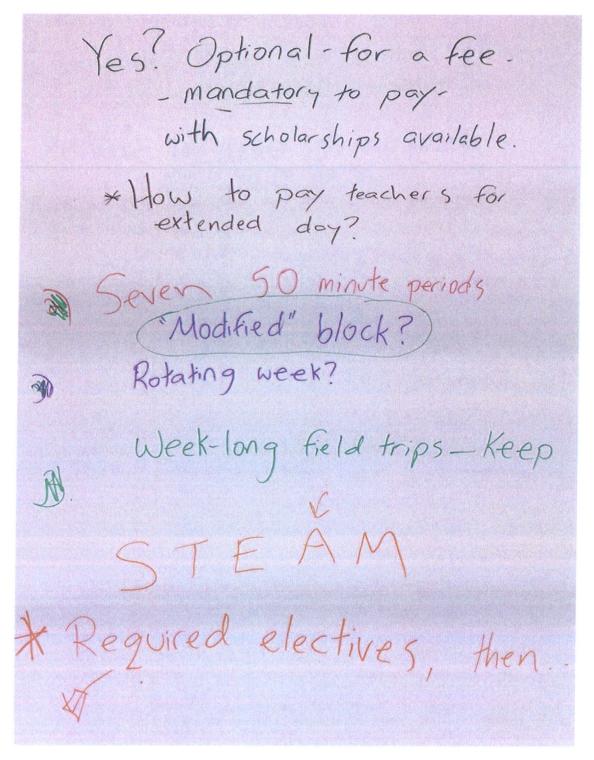

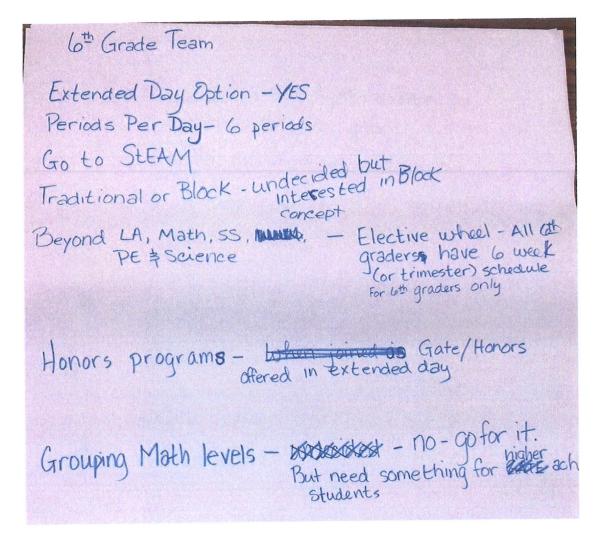

Sexual Harassment

AR 5145.7 **Students**

***Note: For purposes of suspension and expulsion, Education Code 48900.2 defines sexual harassment as conduct, when considered from the perspective of a reasonable person of the same gender as the victim, that is sufficiently severe or pervasive as to have a negative impact upon the victim's academic performance or to create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive educational environment. See AR 5144.1 - Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process. ***

Prohibited sexual harassment includes, but is not limited to, unwelcome sexual advances, unwanted requests for sexual favors, or other unwanted verbal, visual, or physical conduct of a sexual nature made against another person of the same or opposite sex in the educational setting, when made on the basis of sex and under any of the following conditions: (Education Code 212.5; 5 CCR 4916)

- 1. Submission to the conduct is explicitly or implicitly made a term or condition of a student's academic status or progress.
- 2. Submission to or rejection of the conduct by a student is used as the basis for academic decisions affecting the student.
- 3. The conduct has the purpose or effect of having a negative impact on the student's academic performance or of creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive educational environment.
- 4. Submission to or rejection of the conduct by the student is used as the basis for any decision affecting the student regarding benefits and services, honors, programs, or activities available at or through any district program or activity.

(cf. 5131 - Conduct)

***Note: The following list contains common examples of sexual harassment from the U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights' (OCR) April 2011 Dear Colleague Letter: Sexual Violence, its January 2001 publication Revised Sexual Harassment Guidance, and definitions specified in 5 CCR 4916.

Examples of types of conduct which are prohibited in the district and which may constitute sexual harassment include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Unwelcome leering, sexual flirtations, or propositions
- 2. Unwelcome sexual slurs, epithets, threats, verbal abuse, derogatory comments, or sexually degrading descriptions
- 3. Graphic verbal comments about an individual's body or overly personal conversation
- 4. Sexual jokes, derogatory posters, notes, stories, cartoons, drawings, pictures, obscene gestures, or computer-generated images of a sexual nature
- 5. Spreading sexual rumors
- 6. Teasing or sexual remarks about students enrolled in a predominantly single-sex class
- 7. Massaging, grabbing, fondling, stroking, or brushing the body
- 8. Touching an individual's body or clothes in a sexual way
- 9. Impeding or blocking movements or any physical interference with school activities when directed at an individual on the basis of sex
- 10. Displaying sexually suggestive objects
- 11. Sexual assault, sexual battery, or sexual coercion

School-Level Complaint Process/Grievance Procedure

***Note: In its April 2011 Dear Colleague Letter: Sexual Violence and January 2001 Revised Sexual Harassment Guidance, OCR acknowledges that procedures adopted by districts to address student harassment complaints will vary considerably depending on a number of factors, including the size of the district. Items #1-8 below reflect the factors relied on by OCR to ensure that a district's procedures are "prompt and equitable" and are effective in remedying sexual harassment and preventing recurrence. ***

***Note: While OCR requires prompt resolution of complaints, neither the law nor OCR delineates specific time frames. OCR also recommends that the district's procedure include designated and reasonably prompt timelines for the major stages of the complaint process. The timelines suggested below will normally be sufficient to comply with OCR's Guidance; however, OCR acknowledges that whether a complaint is considered "prompt" may vary depending on the seriousness and complexity of the circumstances. ***

***Note: Pursuant to 34 CFR 106.8, the district is required to designate a person(s) responsible for the overall implementation of the requirements of Title IX, including the receipt of complaints. For language designating a district Coordinator for Nondiscrimination, see BP 5145.3 - Nondiscrimination/Harassment.

Depending on the size and structure of the district, sexual harassment complaints may be investigated either by the Coordinator or principal at the applicable school site, in which case the Coordinator would be responsible for overall coordination and oversight to ensure consistency across the district. The following section should be revised to reflect the title of the position responsible for investigation of sexual harassment complaints. ***

***Note: The following optional grievance procedure, including any applicable timelines, is based on OCR recommendations and may be revised to reflect district practice. ***

Complaints of sexual harassment, or any behavior prohibited by the district's Nondiscrimination/Harassment policy - BP 5145.3, shall be handled in accordance with the following procedure:

1. Notice and Receipt of Complaint: Any student who believes he/she has been subjected to sexual harassment or who has witnessed sexual harassment may file a complaint with any school employee. Within 24 hours of receiving a complaint, the school employee shall report it to the district Coordinator for Nondiscrimination/Principal. In addition, any school employee who observes any incident of sexual harassment involving a student shall, within 24 hours, report this observation to the Coordinator/Principal, whether or not the victim files a complaint.

In any case of sexual harassment involving the Coordinator/Principal to whom the complaint would ordinarily be made, the employee who receives the student's report or who observes the incident shall instead report to the Superintendent or designee.

***Note: In its April 2011 Dear Colleague Letter: Sexual Violence, OCR cautions that districts may have an obligation to respond to student-on-student sexual harassment which occurs off school grounds or outside school-sponsored or school-related programs or activities, since the sexual harassment may still create a hostile environment for the victim at school. ***

2. Initiation of Investigation: The Coordinator/Principal shall initiate an impartial investigation of an allegation of sexual harassment within five school days of receiving notice of the harassing behavior, regardless of whether a formal complaint has been filed. The district shall be considered to have "notice" of the need for an investigation upon receipt of information from a student who believes he/she has been subjected to harassment, the student's parent/guardian, an employee who received a complaint from a student, or any employee or student who witnessed the behavior.

***Note: According to the OCR's Guidance, while the nature and extent of the district's investigation may be limited if the student wishes to remain anonymous or decides to not file a complaint, the district must still take all feasible steps to respond to harassment of which it has notice. ***

If the Coordinator/Principal receives an anonymous complaint or media report about alleged sexual harassment, he/she shall determine whether it is reasonable to pursue an investigation considering the specificity and reliability of the information, the seriousness of the alleged incident, and whether any individuals can be identified who were subjected to the alleged harassment.

- Initial Interview with Student: When a student or parent/guardian has complained or provided information about sexual harassment, the Coordinator/Principal shall describe the district's grievance procedure and discuss what actions are being sought by the student in response to the complaint. The student who is complaining shall have an opportunity to describe the incident, identify witnesses who may have relevant information, provide other evidence of the harassment, and put his/her complaint in writing. If the student requests confidentiality, he/she shall be informed that such a request may limit the district's ability to investigate.
- 4. Investigation Process: The Coordinator/Principal shall keep the complaint and allegation confidential, except as necessary to carry out the investigation or take other subsequent necessary action. (5 CCR 4964)

The Coordinator/Principal shall interview individuals who are relevant to the investigation, including, but not limited to, the student who is complaining, the person accused of harassment, anyone who witnessed the reported harassment, and anyone mentioned as having relevant information. The Coordinator/Principal may take other steps such as reviewing any records, notes, or statements related to the harassment or visiting the location where the harassment is alleged to have taken place.

When necessary to carry out his/her investigation or to protect student safety, the Coordinator/Principal also may discuss the complaint with the Superintendent or designee, the parent/guardian of the student who complained, the parent/guardian of the alleged harasser if the alleged harasser is a student, a teacher or staff member whose knowledge of the students involved may help in determining who is telling the truth, law enforcement and/or child protective services, and district legal counsel or the district's risk manager.

(cf. 5141.4 - Child Abuse Prevention and Reporting)

- 5. Interim Measures: The Coordinator/Principal shall determine whether interim measures are necessary during and pending the results of the investigation, such as placing students in separate classes or transferring a student to a class taught by a different teacher.
- 6. Optional Mediation: In cases of student-on-student harassment, when the student who complained and the alleged harasser so agree, the Coordinator/Principal may arrange for them to resolve the complaint informally with the help of a counselor, teacher, administrator, or trained mediator. The student who complained shall never be asked to work out the problem directly with the accused person unless such help is provided and both parties agree, and he/she shall be advised of the right to end the informal process at any time.

(cf. 5138 - Conflict Resolution)

7. Factors in Reaching a Determination: In reaching a decision about the complaint, the

Coordinator/Principal may take into account:

- a. Statements made by the persons identified above
- b. The details and consistency of each person's account
- c. Evidence of how the complaining student reacted to the incident
- d. Evidence of any past instances of harassment by the alleged harasser
- e. Evidence of any past harassment complaints that were found to be untrue

To judge the severity of the harassment, the Coordinator/Principal may take into consideration:

- a. How the misconduct affected one or more students' education
- b. The type, frequency, and duration of the misconduct
- c. The identity, age, and sex of the harasser and the student who complained, and the relationship between them
- d. The number of persons engaged in the harassing conduct and at whom the harassment was directed
- e. The size of the school, location of the incidents, and context in which they occurred
- f. Other incidents at the school involving different students
- 8. Written Report on Findings and Follow-Up: No more than 30 days after receiving the complaint, the Coordinator/Principal shall conclude the investigation and prepare a written report of his/her findings. This timeline may be extended for good cause. If an extension is needed, the Coordinator/Principal shall notify the student who complained and explain the reasons for the extension.

***Note: In its September 2008 publication, Sexual Harassment: It's Not Academic, OCR states that the appropriate steps and responsive measures to remedy a violation should be tailored to the specific situation. Examples of appropriate measures might include the development of new policies, counseling, training, separating the victim and the harasser, or providing services to the student who was harassed, such as tutoring or grade adjustment. ***

The report shall include the decision and the reasons for the decision and shall summarize the steps taken during the investigation. If it is determined that harassment occurred, the report shall also include any corrective actions that have or will be taken to address the harassment and prevent any retaliation or further harassment. This report shall be presented to the student who complained, the person accused, the parents/guardians of the student who complained and the student who was accused, and the Superintendent or

designee.

In addition, the Coordinator/Principal shall ensure that the harassed student and his/her parent/guardian are informed of the procedures for reporting any subsequent problems. The Coordinator/Principal shall make follow-up inquiries to see if there have been any new incidents or retaliation and shall keep a record of this information.

Enforcement of District Policy

The Superintendent or designee shall take appropriate actions to reinforce the district's sexual harassment policy. As needed, these actions may include any of the following:

Removing vulgar or offending graffiti

(cf. 5131.5 - Vandalism and Graffiti)

***Note: Government Code 12950.1 requires any district with 50 or more employees to provide two hours of sexual harassment training and education to supervisory employees once every two years. See AR 4119.11/4219.11/4319.11 - Sexual Harassment. In addition, in its April 2011 Dear Colleague Letter: Sexual Violence, OCR underlies the importance of training in preventing and responding to sexual harassment and encourages districts to provide training to all segments of the school community. ***

2. Providing training to students, staff, and parents/guardians about how to recognize harassment and how to respond

5. Taking appropriate disciplinary action

In addition, disciplinary measures may be taken against any person who is found to have made a complaint of sexual harassment which he/she knew was not true.

Notifications

***Note: In its January 2001 Revised Sexual Harassment Guidance, OCR states that a procedure for sexual harassment complaints cannot be prompt or equitable unless it is widely disseminated and written in language appropriate to the age of the school's students so that students understand how it works. Examples include having copies of the procedures available throughout the school, publishing the procedures in the student handbook, and identifying individuals who can explain how the procedure works. ***

A copy of the district's sexual harassment policy and regulation shall:

1. Be included in the notifications that are sent to parents/guardians at the beginning of each school year (Education Code 48980; 5 CCR 4917)

(cf. 5145.6 - Parental Notifications)

- 2. Be displayed in a prominent location in the main administrative building or other area where notices of district rules, regulations, procedures, and standards of conduct are posted, including school web sites (Education Code 231.5)
- 3. Be provided as part of any orientation program conducted for new students at the beginning of each quarter, semester, or summer session (Education Code 231.5)
- 4. Appear in any school or district publication that sets forth the school's or district's comprehensive rules, regulations, procedures, and standards of conduct (Education Code 231.5)

***Note: Items #5 and #6 below are optional. ***

- 5. Be referenced in the student handbook
- 6. Be provided to employees and employee organizations

Sexual Harassment

BP 5145.7 **Students**

***Note: Education Code 231.5 and 34 CFR 106.9 mandate the district to have written policies on sexual harassment. The following policy addresses harassment by and/or of students; for policy addressing the sexual harassment by and/or of employees, see BP/AR 4119.11/4219.11/4319.11 - Sexual Harassment. ***

***Note: A district can be held liable for student-on-student or employee-on-student sexual harassment pursuant to Title IX (20 USC 1681-1688) and/or Education Code 220, if the district is found to have been "deliberately indifferent" in its response to known sexual harassment. In Davis v. Monroe County Board of Education, the Supreme Court held that a district would be deliberately indifferent if (1) the harasser and the context in which the sexual harassment occurred were within the district's control; (2) the harassment was so severe, pervasive, and objectively offensive that it deprived the victim of access to educational opportunities or benefits provided by the district; (3) the district had actual knowledge of the harassment; and (4) the district's conduct was unreasonable considering the surrounding circumstances. This standard was applied by an appellate court in Donovan v. Poway Unified School District based on Education Code 220. ***

***Note: In addition to filing a private civil lawsuit, a victim of sexual harassment may file a complaint with the California Department of Education and/or the U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights (OCR). In April 2011, OCR issued its Dear Colleague Letter: Sexual Violence to supplement its January 2001 Revised Sexual Harassment Guidance on federal Title IX requirements as they pertain to sexual harassment. In the letter, OCR clarifies that sexual violence, including rape, sexual assault, sexual battery, and sexual coercion, is a form of sexual harassment that must be addressed by districts in the same way as other forms of sexual harassment, such as unwelcome sexual advances. ***

The Governing Board is committed to maintaining a safe school environment that is free from harassment and discrimination. The Board prohibits sexual harassment of students at school or at school-sponsored or school-related activities. The Board also prohibits retaliatory behavior or action against any person who files a complaint, testifies, or otherwise participates in district complaint processes.

Instruction/Information

***Note: In its April 2011 Dear Colleague Letter: Sexual Violence, OCR restates the requirement that a district's procedure for investigating sexual harassment complaints must be widely disseminated and be written in language appropriate to the age of the school's students so that students understand how it works. Examples include having copies of the procedure available throughout the school, publishing the procedure in the student handbook, and identifying individuals who can explain how the procedure works. The following optional section is based on OCR recommendations and may be revised to better accommodate student needs and district practice. ***

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all district students receive age-appropriate instruction and information on sexual harassment. Such instruction and information shall include:

1. What acts and behavior constitute sexual harassment, including the fact that sexual harassment could occur between people of the same sex and could involve sexual violence

***Note: In its April 2011 Dear Colleague Letter: Sexual Violence, OCR acknowledges that possible rule violations by victims or other students may affect their willingness to report sexual harassment or violence. For example, a victim who is sexually harassed while he/she is away from school without permission may be reluctant to file a complaint if he/she believes that he/she may be disciplined for the violation. Thus, OCR suggests that, in communicating items #2 and #3 below, districts should emphasize that student safety is the primary concern and that any other rule violation will be addressed separately from the sexual harassment or violence issue. ***

- 2. A clear message that students do not have to endure sexual harassment
- 3. Encouragement to report observed instances of sexual harassment, even where the victim of the harassment has not complained
- 4. Information about the district's procedure for investigating complaints and the person(s) to whom a report of sexual harassment should be made
- 5. Information about the rights of students and parents/guardians to file a criminal complaint, as applicable

Complaint Process

***Note: Pursuant to Education Code 231.5, the district's policy must contain information on where to obtain a specific procedure for reporting charges of sexual harassment and pursuing available remedies. In addition, 34 CFR 106.8 requires a district to adopt and publish a grievance procedure providing for a prompt and equitable resolution of student complaints alleging sexual harassment. Because courts have held that a district may be liable for student-on-student harassment if an employee with authority to take corrective action has actual knowledge of the harassment, it is recommended that the district's instruction to its students include examples of employees who may have such authority (e.g., principals, teachers, and coaches). In addition, even if the matter has been referred to law enforcement for investigation, a district

***Note: The accompanying administrative regulation details a site-level complaint procedure, including timelines, conduct of the investigation, and remedies. However, districts may instead consider using the uniform complaint procedures, pursuant to 5 CCR 4600-4687, to resolve such complaints; see BP/AR 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures. ***

Any student who feels that he/she is being or has been sexually harassed on school grounds or at a school-sponsored or school-related activity (e.g., by a visiting athlete or coach) shall immediately contact his/her teacher or any other employee. An employee who receives such a complaint shall report it in accordance with administrative regulation.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that any complaints regarding sexual harassment are immediately investigated in accordance with administrative regulation. When the Superintendent or designee has determined that harassment has occurred, he/she shall take prompt, appropriate action to end the harassment and to address its effects on the victim.

Disciplinary Actions

***Note: Pursuant to Education Code 48900.2, a student in grades 4-12 may be suspended and/or expelled from school for sexual harassment. However, districts should note that Education Code 48915(c) requires the Superintendent or designee to recommend expulsion for any student, irrespective of grade, who commits sexual assault or battery as defined in the Penal Code. See AR 5144.1 - Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process. ***

Any student who engages in sexual harassment or sexual violence at school or at a school-sponsored or school-related activity is in violation of this policy and shall be subject to disciplinary action. For students in grades 4-12, disciplinary action may include suspension and/or expulsion, provided that, in imposing such discipline, the entire circumstances of the incident(s) shall be taken into account.

Confidentiality and Record-Keeping

***Note: Pursuant to 5 CCR 4964, districts are required to keep complaints and allegations of sexual harassment confidential, except when disclosure is necessary to further the investigation, other needed remedial action, or ongoing monitoring. In its April 2011 Dear Colleague Letter: Sexual Violence, OCR counsels districts to respond to sexual harassment that comes to their attention even when a victim requests anonymity. ***

All complaints and allegations of sexual harassment shall be kept confidential except as

necessary to carry out the investigation or take other subsequent necessary action. (5 CCR 4964)

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain a record of all reported cases of sexual harassment to enable the district to monitor, address, and prevent repetitive harassing behavior in the schools.

Sexual Harassment

Note: Education Code 231.5 mandates the district to have written policies on sexual harassment. The following policy addresses harassment by and of students in the school setting.

Note: Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (20 USC 1681-1688) prohibits discrimination based on sex by recipients of federal financial assistance. School districts are responsible under Title IX and the regulations for the issuance of a policy against sex discrimination (34 CFR 106.8). Sexual harassment is a form of sex discrimination under Title IX and can deny or limit a student's ability to participate in or receive education benefits, services, or opportunities on the basis of that student's sex.

Note: A district can be held liable for civil damages for the sexual harassment of students pursuant to Title IX and/or Education Code 220, if the district is found to have been "deliberately indifferent" in its response to known sexual harassment. In Davis v. Monroe County Board of Education, the U.S. Supreme Court held that a district would be deliberately indifferent if (1) the harasser and the context in which the sexual harassment occurred were within the district's control; (2) the harassment was so severe, pervasive, and objectively offensive that it deprived a student of access to educational opportunities or benefits provided by the district; (3) the district had actual knowledge of the harassment; and (4) the district's conduct was unreasonable considering the surrounding circumstances. This standard was applied by an appellate court in Donovan v. Poway Unified School District based on Education Code 220.

Note: In addition to filing a private civil lawsuit, an alleged victim of sexual harassment may file a complaint with the California Department of Education (CDE) and/or the U.S. Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights (OCR), the federal agency responsible for administrative enforcement of federal laws and regulations that prohibit discrimination in programs and activities that receive federal financial assistance from the U.S. Department of Education. OCR applies a different standard than the "deliberate indifference" standard when addressing complaints against a district. Under OCR's enforcement standards, a district may be held to be in violation when a student is subjected to harassing conduct by another student, an employee, or a third party, and (1) the district knows or should know about the harassment, (2) the harassment is sufficiently serious as to create a hostile educational environment for the student, and (3) the district failed to take appropriate responsive actions. In other words, while a district is not responsible for the conduct of the other student or the third party, it may be liable for failing to respond adequately once it has notice. However, if a student is sexually harassed by an employee who was acting in the context of his/her job responsibilities, the district may be in violation of Title IX whether or not it has notice.

Note: CSBA staff met with representatives from CDE and OCR to discuss this policy and the accompanying regulation as they relate to the uniform complaint procedure (UCP) requirements. As a result, the sample policy and regulation have been drafted to go beyond the minimal requirements under California's UCP laws and regulations in an attempt to address issues and concerns raised by CDE and OCR. While CDE and OCR have not approved or signed off on them, CSBA believes that the additional details provided herein may help school districts and

county offices of education during any compliance check by CDE or in the event that a CDE or OCR investigation occurs.

The Governing Board is committed to maintaining a safe school environment that is free from harassment and discrimination. The Board prohibits, at school or at school-sponsored or school-related activities, sexual harassment targeted at any student by anyone. The Board also prohibits retaliatory behavior or action against any person who reports, files a complaint or testifies about, or otherwise supports a complainant in alleging sexual harassment.

Note: OCR's January 2001 Revised Sexual Harassment Guidance notes that, regardless of whether a harassed student, his/her parent/guardian, or a third party files a complaint under the district procedures or otherwise requests action on the student's behalf, a school that knows, or reasonably should know, about possible harassment must promptly take action to determine what occurred and then take appropriate steps to resolve the situation. Even where a parent/guardian or student does not wish to disclose the student's identity, there are steps a school can take to limit the effects of alleged harassment and prevent its recurrence without initiating formal action. Such steps may include limited investigative activities and actions to protect the complainant and the school community and prevent recurrence while keeping the identity of the complainant confidential. These actions may include providing services to the complainant, such as counseling services; providing increased monitoring, supervision, or security at locations or activities where the misconduct occurred; providing training and education materials for students and employees; or changing and publicizing the school's policies on sexual violence. OCR has indicated that the principles in its Revised Sexual Harassment Guidance also apply to harassment based on race, color, national origin, disability, or age.

Note: It is also important to note that a referral to law enforcement does not relieve a school district of its responsibility to investigate the complaint as a matter of sex discrimination.

The district strongly encourages any student who feels that he/she is being or has been sexually harassed on school grounds or at a school-sponsored or school-related activity by another student or an adult, or who has experienced off-campus sexual harassment that has a continuing effect on campus, to immediately contact his/her teacher, the principal, or any other available school employee. Any employee who receives a report or observes an incident of sexual harassment shall notify the principal or a district compliance officer. Once notified, the principal or compliance officer shall take the steps to investigate and address the allegation, as specified in the accompanying administrative regulation.

The Superintendent or designee shall take appropriate actions to reinforce the district's sexual harassment policy.

Instruction/Information

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all district students receive age-appropriate information on sexual harassment. Such instruction and information shall include:

- 1. What acts and behavior constitute sexual harassment, including the fact that sexual harassment could occur between people of the same sex and could involve sexual violence
- 2. A clear message that students do not have to endure sexual harassment under any circumstance
- 3. Encouragement to report observed incidents of sexual harassment even where the alleged victim of the harassment has not complained

Note: Where sexual harassment or violence occurs in the context of other possible rule violations, students may be reluctant to report sexual harassment or violence. For example, a student who is sexually harassed while he/she is away from school without permission may be reluctant to file a complaint if he/she believes that he/she may be disciplined for the violation. As such, item #4 below clarifies that any other rule violation will be addressed separately from the sexual harassment complaint in order to encourage students to report the harassment.

- 4. A clear message that student safety is the district's primary concern, and that any separate rule violation involving an alleged victim or any other person reporting a sexual harassment incident will be addressed separately and will not affect the manner in which the sexual harassment complaint will be received, investigated, or resolved
- 5. A clear message that, regardless of a complainant's noncompliance with the writing, timeline, or other formal filing requirements, every sexual harassment allegation that involves a student, whether as the complainant, respondent, or victim of the harassment, shall be investigated and prompt action shall be taken to stop any harassment, prevent recurrence, and address any continuing effect on students
- 6. Information about the district's procedure for investigating complaints and the person(s) to whom a report of sexual harassment should be made
- 7. Information about the rights of students and parents/guardians to file a civil or criminal complaint, as applicable, including the right to file a civil or criminal complaint while the district investigation of a sexual harassment complaint continues
- 8. A clear message that, when needed, the district will take interim measures to ensure a safe school



environment for a student who is the complainant or victim of sexual harassment and/or other students during an investigation and that, to the extent possible, when such interim measures are taken, they shall not disadvantage the complainant or victim of the alleged harassment

Complaint Process and Disciplinary Actions

Note: Pursuant to Education Code 231.5, the district's policy must contain information on where to obtain a specific procedure for reporting incidents of sexual harassment and pursuing available remedies. In addition, 34 CFR 106.8 requires a district to adopt and publish a complaint procedure providing for a prompt and equitable resolution of student complaints alleging sexual harassment. To avoid confusion that may arise from having a multiplicity of complaint processes for resolving a variety of student complaints, it is recommended that districts use the UCP to investigate and resolve sexual harassment complaints involving students. See AR 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures for details of these procedures.

Sexual harassment complaints by and against students shall be investigated and resolved in accordance with law and district procedures specified in AR 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures. Principals are responsible for notifying students and parents/guardians that complaints of sexual harassment can be filed under AR 1312.3 and where to obtain a copy of the procedures.

(cf. 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures)

Note: Pursuant to Education Code 48900.2, a student in grades 4-12 may be suspended and/or expelled from school for sexual harassment. Education Code 48900.2 also requires the sexual harassment, when considered from the perspective of a reasonable person of the same gender as the alleged victim, to be sufficiently severe or pervasive as to have a negative impact upon the alleged victim's academic performance or to create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive educational environment for the alleged victim. Under OCR's 2001 Revised Sexual Harassment Guidance interpreting Title IX, a hostile environment is created when the conduct is sufficiently serious that it denies or limits a student's ability to participate in or benefit from the school's program based on sex. OCR considers the conduct from both the subjective perspective of the individual who was harassed and from the perspective of a reasonable person with the same characteristics as the alleged victim. Districts should also note that Education Code 48915(c) requires the Superintendent or designee to recommend expulsion for any student, irrespective of grade, who commits sexual assault or battery as defined in the Penal Code. See AR 5144.1 - Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process.

Upon investigation of a sexual harassment complaint, any student found to have engaged in sexual harassment or sexual violence in violation of this policy shall be subject to disciplinary action. For students in grades 4-12, disciplinary action may include suspension and/or expulsion, provided that, in imposing such discipline, the entire circumstances of the incident(s) shall be taken into account.

Upon investigation of a sexual harassment complaint, any employee found to have engaged in sexual harassment or sexual violence toward any student shall have his/her employment terminated in accordance with law and the applicable collective bargaining agreement.

Record-Keeping

The Superintendent or designee shall maintain a record of all reported cases of sexual harassment to enable the district to monitor, address, and prevent repetitive harassing behavior in district schools.

Administrative Regulation

Sexual Harassment

AR 4119.11 4219.11,4319.11 **Personnel**

Definitions

Note: In Oncale v. Sundowner Offshore Services, Inc., the Supreme Court held that same-sex sexual harassment could be actionable under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 USC 2000e-2000e-17).

Prohibited sexual harassment includes, but is not limited to, unwelcome sexual advances, unwanted requests for sexual favors, or other unwanted verbal, visual, or physical conduct of a sexual nature made against another person of the same or opposite sex in the work or educational setting when: (Education Code 212.5; 5 CCR 4916)

- 1. Submission to the conduct is made explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of the individual's employment.
- 2. Submission to or rejection of such conduct by the individual is used as the basis for an employment decision affecting him/her.
- 3. The conduct has the purpose or effect of having a negative impact upon the individual's work or has the purpose or effect of creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work environment. The conduct is sufficiently severe, persistent, pervasive, or objectively offensive so as to create a hostile or abusive working environment or to limit the individual's ability to participate in or benefit from an education program or activity.
- 4. Submission to or rejection of the conduct by the other individual is used as the basis for any decision affecting him/her regarding benefits, services, honors, programs, or activities available at or through the district.

Note: Pursuant to Government Code 12940, an employer may be held liable for sexual harassment committed against employees by clients, customers, or other third parties if the employer knew, or should have known, of the harassment and failed to take immediate and appropriate corrective action to stop the harassment. The following paragraph clarifies that sexual harassment may include acts by supervisors, co-workers, or other parties and should be modified to reflect district practice.

Other examples of actions that might constitute sexual harassment, whether committed by a supervisor, a co-worker, or a non-employee, in the work or educational setting, include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Unwelcome verbal conduct such as sexual flirtations or propositions; graphic comments about an individual's body; overly personal conversations or pressure for sexual activity; sexual jokes or stories; unwelcome sexual slurs, epithets, threats, innuendoes, derogatory comments, sexually degrading descriptions, or the spreading of sexual rumors
- 2. Unwelcome visual conduct such as drawings, pictures, graffiti, or gestures; sexually explicit emails; displaying sexually suggestive objects
- 3. Unwelcome physical conduct such as massaging, grabbing, fondling, stroking, or brushing the body; touching an individual's body or clothes in a sexual way; cornering, blocking, leaning over, or impeding normal movements

Prohibited sexual harassment may also include any act of retaliation against an individual who reports a violation of the district's sexual harassment policy or who participates in the investigation of a sexual harassment complaint.

Training

Note: Government Code 12950.1 requires any district with 50 or more employees to provide two hours of sexual harassment training and education to supervisory employees once every two years. All newly hired supervisors or employees promoted to a supervisory position must receive the training within six months of their hire or assumption of the supervisory position. Compliance with this law does not insulate the district from any liability for harassment.

Note: Pursuant to 2 CCR 7288.0, as added by Register 2007, No. 29, the definition of "supervisor" in Government Code 12926 is applicable to this training requirement. Government Code 12926 defines "supervisor" broadly as any individual having the authority to hire, transfer, suspend, lay off, promote, discharge, assign, reward, or discipline other employees or to effectively recommend that action if the exercise of that authority is not merely routine or clerical in nature. Governing Board members, as elected officials, are not usually considered "supervisors"; however, since Board members have the authority to hire, reward, or discipline the Superintendent and other employees, Board members may also be required to receive sexual harassment training. Districts should consult with legal counsel to ensure that the appropriate individuals receive training.

Note: The following section is for use by districts with 50 or more employees. Although the law does not require districts with fewer than 50 employees to provide sexual harassment training to supervisors, court decisions have held that providing training may help mitigate damages in sexual harassment suits. Districts with fewer than 50 employees may delete or modify the following section to reflect district practice.

Every two years, the Superintendent or designee shall ensure that supervisory employees receive at least two hours of classroom or other effective interactive training and education regarding sexual harassment. All newly hired or promoted supervisory employees shall receive training within six months of their assumption of the supervisory position. (Government Code 12950.1)

Note: Government Code 12950.1 and 2 CCR 7288.0, as added by Register 2007, No. 29, require that the training contain specified components and be presented by trainers or educators with knowledge and expertise in the prevention of harassment, discrimination, and retaliation. Pursuant to 2 CCR 7288.0, employers may offer computer-based training, but such training must be interactive and provide a link as to how to contact a trainer who shall be able to answer any questions within two business days.

The district's training and education program for supervisory employees shall include information and practical guidance regarding the federal and state laws on the prohibition against and the prevention and correction of sexual harassment, and the remedies available to the victims of sexual harassment in employment. The training shall also include all of the content specified in 2 CCR 7288.0 and practical examples aimed at instructing supervisors in the prevention of harassment, discrimination, and retaliation. (Government Code 12950.1; 2 CCR 7288.0)

Note: Although the law does not require districts with 50 or more employees to provide training to non-supervisory employees or districts with less than 50 employees to train any employee, it is recommended that all districts provide training to each employee because court decisions have held that providing training may help mitigate damages in sexual harassment lawsuits. In Department of Health Services v. Superior Court (McGinnis), the California Supreme Court held that employers that have taken reasonable steps to prevent and correct workplace sexual harassment may be able to reduce damages in the event of a lawsuit. Such steps may include establishing antiharassment policies and communicating those policies to employees. The following optional paragraph is consistent with the court's guidance and should be modified to reflect district practice.

In addition, the Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all employees receive periodic training regarding the district's sexual harassment policy, particularly the procedures for filing complaints and employees' duty to use the district's complaint procedures.

Notifications

Note: Education Code 231.5 requires that the district provide copies of its policy on sexual harassment to staff, as specified below. In addition, 2 CCR 7288.0, as added by Register 2007, No. 29, requires that supervisory employees undergoing mandatory training receive a copy of the district's policy and acknowledge receipt of the policy.

A copy of the Board policy and this administrative regulation shall: (Education Code 231.5)

- 1. Be displayed in a prominent location in the main administrative building, district office, or other area of the school where notices of district rules, regulations, procedures, and standards of conduct are posted
- 2. Be provided to each faculty member, all members of the administrative staff, and all members of the support staff at the beginning of the first quarter or semester of the school year or whenever a new employee is hired

(cf. 4112.9/4212.9/4312.9 - Employee Notifications)

3. Appear in any school or district publication that sets forth the school's or district's comprehensive rules, regulations, procedures, and standards of conduct

Note: Government Code 12950 requires the Department of Fair Employment and Housing (DFEH) to develop posters and information sheets on employment discrimination and the illegality of sexual harassment. These documents are available on DFEH's web site.

All employees shall receive either a copy of information sheets prepared by the California Department of Fair Employment and Housing (DFEH) or a copy of district information sheets that contain, at a minimum, components on: (Government Code 12950)

- 1. The illegality of sexual harassment
- 2. The definition of sexual harassment under applicable state and federal law
- 3. A description of sexual harassment, with examples
- 4. The district's complaint process available to the employee

(cf. 4031 - Complaints Concerning Discrimination in Employment)

- 5. The legal remedies and complaint process available through DFEH and the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC)
- 6. Directions on how to contact DFEH and the EEOC
- 7. The protection against retaliation provided by 2 CCR 7287.8 for opposing harassment prohibited by law or for filing a complaint with or otherwise participating in an investigation, proceeding, or hearing conducted by DFEH and the EEOC

In addition, the district shall post, in a prominent and accessible location, DFEH's poster on discrimination in employment and the illegality of sexual harassment. (Government Code 12950)

Sexual Harassment

Note: Education Code 231.5 mandates the district to have a written policy on sexual harassment. As part of this mandate, the district also should adopt a sexual harassment policy related to students; see BP/AR 5145.7 - Sexual Harassment.

Note: Generally, courts recognize two types of conduct as constituting sexual harassment. "Quid Pro Quo" ("this for that") sexual harassment is considered to have occurred when a person in a position of authority makes another individual's educational or employment benefits conditional upon that other person's willingness to engage in unwanted sexual behavior (e.g., promising a promotion for sex). "Hostile environment" sexual harassment, on the other hand, is conduct by the perpetrator that is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that it creates a hostile, intimidating, or abusive educational or professional environment for another. Sexual harassment also covers retaliatory behavior against a complainant, witness, or other participant in the complaint process.

Note: Sexual harassment may be a violation of Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 USC 2000e-2000e-17) and/or Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (42 USC 2000h-2-2000h-6), as well as the California Fair Employment and Housing Act, Government Code 12900-12996.

Note: Government Code 12940 and 34 CFR 106.9 extend protection against sexual harassment to job applicants. In addition, pursuant to Government Code 12940, employers may be held liable for sexual harassment committed against their workers by clients, customers, or other third parties if they knew or should have known of the harassment and failed to take immediate and appropriate corrective action to stop the harassment.

The Governing Board prohibits sexual harassment of district employees and job applicants. The Board also prohibits retaliatory behavior or action against district employees or other persons who complain, testify or otherwise participate in the complaint process established pursuant to this policy and administrative regulation.

(cf. 0410 - Nondiscrimination in District Programs and Activities) (cf. 4030 - Nondiscrimination in Employment)

***Note: Federal and state courts have provided guidance that may help employers avoid liability or mitigate damages in sexual harassment cases. In Department of Health Service v. Superior Court (McGinnis), the California Supreme Court outlined ways in which employers may be able to reduce damages including establishing anti-harassment policies, communicating those policies to employees, consistently enforcing their policies, preserving the confidentiality of employees who report harassment, and preventing retaliation against reporting employees. The United States Supreme Court has held, in Burlington Industries v. Ellerth, that, for certain claims under federal law, an employer may defend against sexual harassment claims by proving that: (1) reasonable care was exercised to prevent and promptly correct any sexually harassing behavior, and (2) the employee (victim) failed to take advantage of the preventive and corrective opportunities provided by the employer. ***

***Note: Pursuant to Government Code 12950.1, as added by AB 1825 (Ch. 933, Statutes of 2004), employers with 50 or more employees are required to provide two hours of sexual harassment training to supervisory employees. See the accompanying administrative regulation for timelines and training requirements. ***

Note: Items #1-4 below reflect the courts' guidance and Government Code 12950.1 and should be modified to reflect district practice.

The Superintendent or designee shall take all actions necessary to ensure the prevention, investigation, and correction of sexual harassment, including but not limited to:

- 1. Providing training to employees in accordance with law and administrative regulation
- 2. Publicizing and disseminating the district's sexual harassment policy to staff

(cf. 4112.9/4212.9/4312.9 - Employee Notifications)

- 3. Ensuring prompt, thorough, and fair investigation of complaints
- 4. Taking timely and appropriate corrective/remedial action(s), which may require interim separation of the complainant and the alleged harasser and subsequent monitoring of developments

All complaints and allegations of sexual harassment shall be kept confidential to the extent necessary to carry out the investigation or to take other subsequent necessary actions. (5 CCR 4964)

Any district employee or job applicant who feels that he/she has been sexually harassed or who has knowledge of any incident of sexual harassment by or against another employee, a job applicant or a student, should immediately report the incident to his/her supervisor, the principal, district administrator or Superintendent.

A supervisor, principal or other district administrator who receives a harassment complaint shall promptly notify the Superintendent or designee.

***Note: In Faragher v. City of Boca Raton, one of the factors relied on by the court in finding liability for harassment by a supervisor was the failure of the policy to provide an assurance to its employees that harassing supervisors may be bypassed in registering complaints. ***

Complaints of sexual harassment shall be filed in accordance with AR 4031 - Complaints Concerning Discrimination in Employment. An employee may bypass his/her supervisor in filing a complaint where the supervisor is the subject of the complaint.

(cf. 4031 - Complaints Concerning Discrimination in Employment)

Any district employee who engages or participates in sexual harassment or who aids, abets, incites, compels, or coerces another to commit sexual harassment against a district employee, job applicant, or student is in violation of this policy and is subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

(cf. 4117.4 - Dismissal)

(cf. 4118 - Suspension/Disciplinary Action)

Note: In addition to district sanction against employees who engage in sexual harassment, Government Code 12940 provides that such employees may be held personally liable in a court of law for any damage to the victim(s).

Sexual Harassment

Note: Education Code 231.5 mandates the district to have a written policy on sexual harassment. As part of this mandate, the district also should adopt a sexual harassment policy related to students; see BP/AR 5145.7 - Sexual Harassment.

Note: Generally, courts recognize two types of conduct as constituting sexual harassment. "Quid Pro Quo" ("this for that") sexual harassment is considered to have occurred when a person in a position of authority makes another individual's educational or employment benefits conditional upon that other person's willingness to engage in unwanted sexual behavior (e.g., promising a promotion for sex). "Hostile environment" sexual harassment, on the other hand, is conduct by the perpetrator that is so severe, persistent, or pervasive that it creates a hostile, intimidating, or abusive educational or professional environment for another. Sexual harassment also covers retaliatory behavior against a complainant, witness, or other participant in the complaint process. Pursuant to Government Code 12940 and 2 CCR 11009, interns, volunteers, and job applicants are entitled to the same protection against sexual harassment as applicable to employees.

Note: Sexual harassment is prohibited pursuant to Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 USC 2000e-2000e-17) and/or Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (20 USC 1681-1688), as well as the California Fair Employment and Housing Act (Government Code 12900-12996).

Note: Pursuant to Government Code 12940, employers may be held liable for sexual harassment committed against their workers by clients, customers, or other third parties if they knew or should have known of the harassment and failed to take immediate and appropriate corrective action to stop the harassment.

The Governing Board is committed to providing a safe work environment that is free of harassment and intimidation. The Board prohibits sexual harassment against district employees and retaliatory behavior or action against any person who complains, testifies, or otherwise participates in the complaint process established for the purpose of this policy.

Sexual harassment includes, but is not limited to, harassment that is based on the gender, gender identity, gender expression, or sexual orientation of the victim.

This policy shall apply to all district employees and to other persons on district property or with some employment relationship with the district, such as interns, volunteers, contractors, and job applicants.

(cf. 0410 - Nondiscrimination in District Programs and Activities)

(cf. 4030 - Nondiscrimination in Employment)

Note: In addition to district discipline imposed on employees who engage in sexual harassment, Government Code 12940 provides that such employees may be held personally liable in a court of law for any damage to the victim(s).

Any district employee who engages or participates in sexual harassment or who aids, abets, incites, compels, or coerces another to commit sexual harassment in violation of this policy is subject to disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.

Note: Federal and state courts have provided guidance that may help employers avoid liability or mitigate damages in sexual harassment cases. In Department of Health Services v. Superior Court (McGinnis), the California Supreme Court outlined measures that may constitute mitigating factors in the assessment of damages, including establishing anti-harassment policies, communicating those policies to employees, consistently enforcing the policies, preserving the confidentiality of employees who report harassment, and preventing retaliation against reporting employees. The U.S. Supreme Court in Burlington Industries v. Ellerth held that, for certain claims under federal law, an employer may defend against sexual harassment claims by proving that (1) reasonable care was exercised to prevent and promptly correct any sexually harassing behavior, and (2) the employee (victim) failed to take advantage of the preventive and corrective opportunities provided by the employer.

Note: Pursuant to Government Code 12950.1, employers with 50 or more employees are required to provide two hours of sexual harassment training to supervisory employees. See the accompanying administrative regulation for timelines and training requirements.

Note: Items #1-4 below reflect the courts' guidance and Government Code 12950.1, and should be modified to reflect district practice.

The Superintendent or designee shall take all actions necessary to ensure the prevention, investigation, and correction of sexual harassment, including but not limited to:

- 1. Providing training to employees in accordance with law and administrative regulation
- 2. Publicizing and disseminating the district's sexual harassment policy to employees and others to whom the policy may apply

(cf. 4112.9/4212.9/4312.9 - Employee Notifications)

- 3. Ensuring prompt, thorough, and fair investigation of complaints
- 4. Taking timely and appropriate corrective/remedial action(s), which may require interim separation of the complainant and the alleged harasser and subsequent monitoring of developments

Note: The following optional paragraph reflects a recommendation of the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission's informal guidance Promising Practices for Preventing Harassment and may be revised to reflect district practice.

The Superintendent or designee shall periodically evaluate the effectiveness of the district's strategies to



prevent and address harassment. Such evaluation may involve conducting regular anonymous employee surveys to assess whether harassment is occurring or is perceived to be tolerated, partnering with researchers or other agencies with the needed expertise to evaluate the district's prevention strategies, and using any other effective tool for receiving feedback on systems and/or processes. As necessary, changes shall be made to the harassment policy, complaint procedures, or training.

Sexual Harassment Reports and Complaints

Note: Pursuant to 2 CCR 11034, the district may be liable for sexual harassment committed by a supervisor, coworker, or a third party. In addition, as part of its affirmative duty to prevent sexual harassment, the district is required pursuant to 2 CCR 11023 to instruct supervisors to report complaints.

Any district employee who feels that he/she has been sexually harassed in the performance of his/her district responsibilities or who has knowledge of any incident of sexual harassment by or against another employee shall immediately report the incident to his/her direct supervisor, another supervisor, the district's coordinator for nondiscrimination, the Superintendent, or, if available, a complaint hotline or an ombudsman. A supervisor or administrator who receives a harassment complaint shall promptly notify the coordinator.

Note: In Faragher v. City of Boca Raton, one of the factors relied on by the U.S. Supreme Court in finding liability for harassment by a supervisor was the failure of the policy to provide an assurance to its employees that harassing supervisors may be bypassed in registering complaints.

Complaints of sexual harassment shall be filed and investigated in accordance with the complaint procedure specified in AR 4030 - Nondiscrimination in Employment. An employee may bypass his/her supervisor in filing a complaint where the supervisor is the subject of the complaint.

All complaints and allegations of sexual harassment shall be kept confidential to the extent necessary to carry out the investigation or to take other subsequent necessary actions. (2 CCR 11023)

Sexual Harassment

Note: The following administrative regulation is mandated pursuant to Education Code 231.5 and includes reasonable steps for preventing the occurrence of discrimination and harassment as required pursuant to Government Code 12940 (California Fair Employment and Housing Act). The focus of this administrative regulation is on sexual harassment by and of employees. Pursuant to Government Code 12940 and 2 CCR 11009, interns, volunteers, and job applicants are entitled to the same protection against sexual harassment as applicable to employees.

Note: For information related to sexual harassment involving students, see BP/AR 5145.7 - Sexual Harassment.

This administrative regulation shall apply to all allegations of sexual harassment involving employees, interns, volunteers, and job applicants, but shall not be used to resolve any complaint by or against a student.

Definitions

Note: In Oncale v. Sundowner Offshore Services, Inc., the U.S. Supreme Court held that same-sex sexual harassment could be actionable under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 USC 2000e-2000e-17).

Prohibited sexual harassment includes, but is not limited to, unwelcome sexual advances, unwanted requests for sexual favors, or other unwanted verbal, visual, or physical conduct of a sexual nature made against another person of the same or opposite sex in the work or educational setting when: (Education Code 212.5; Government Code 12940; 2 CCR 11034)

- 1. Submission to the conduct is made explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of the individual's employment.
- 2. Submission to or rejection of the conduct is used as the basis for an employment decision affecting the individual.
- 3. Submission to or rejection of the conduct is used as the basis for any decision affecting the individual regarding benefits, services, honors, programs, or activities available at or through the district.

Note: Pursuant to Government Code 12940, conduct may meet the definition of sexual harassment regardless of whether or not the alleged harasser is motivated by sexual desire for the victim.

Prohibited sexual harassment also includes conduct which, regardless of whether or not it is motivated by sexual desire, is so severe or pervasive as to unreasonably interfere with the victim's work performance or create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work environment.

Note: Pursuant to Government Code 12940, the district may be held liable for sexual harassment committed against employees by clients, customers, or other third parties if the district knew, or should have known, of the harassment and failed to take immediate and appropriate corrective

action to stop the harassment. The following paragraph clarifies that sexual harassment may include acts by supervisors, co-workers, or other parties and should be modified to reflect district practice.

Examples of actions that might constitute sexual harassment in the work or educational setting, whether committed by a supervisor, a co-worker, or a non-employee, include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Unwelcome verbal conduct such as sexual flirtations or propositions; graphic comments about an individual's body; overly personal conversations or pressure for sexual activity; sexual jokes or stories; unwelcome sexual slurs, epithets, threats, innuendoes, derogatory comments, sexually degrading descriptions, or the spreading of sexual rumors
- 2. Unwelcome visual conduct such as drawings, pictures, graffiti, or gestures; sexually explicit emails; displaying sexually suggestive objects
- 3. Unwelcome physical conduct such as massaging, grabbing, fondling, stroking, or brushing the body; touching an individual's body or clothes in a sexual way; cornering, blocking, leaning over, or impeding normal movements

Training

Note: The following paragraph is consistent with a district's affirmative duty to protect its employees from sex discrimination, including sexual harassment, pursuant to 2 CCR 11023. In its informal guidance, Promising Practices for Preventing Harassment, the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission recommends that employers provide sexual harassment training to all employees, not just supervisors and managers. In addition, since BP/AR 5145.7 - Sexual Harassment requires employees to report sexual harassment against students, training employees to recognize and address sexual harassment incidents furthers the district's interest in protecting both employees and students against prohibited conduct. Thus, it is strongly recommended that districts periodically provide sexual harassment training or information to all their employees, especially those who work at school sites.

Note: Provision of periodic training to all district employees could also help foster a positive work environment and mitigate damages against a district in the event of sexual harassment litigation. In Department of Health Services v. Superior Court (McGinnis), the California Supreme Court held that employers that have taken reasonable steps to prevent and correct workplace sexual harassment may be able to reduce damages in the event of a lawsuit. Such steps may include establishing anti-harassment policies and communicating those policies to employees.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all employees receive training regarding the district's sexual harassment policies when hired and periodically thereafter. The training shall include how to recognize prohibited or harassing conduct, the procedures for reporting and/or filing complaints involving an employee, employees' duty to use the district's complaint procedures, and employee obligations when a sexual harassment report involving a student is made to the employee. The training shall also include information about processes for employees to informally share or obtain information about harassment without filing a complaint.

(cf. 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures)

Note: Government Code 12950.1 requires districts with 50 or more employees to provide two hours of sexual harassment training and education once every two years to every supervisory employee, defined as any employee with the authority to take employment action, including hiring, transferring, suspending, and disciplining other employees, or recommend such action if the exercise of that authority is not merely routine or clerical in nature. All newly hired supervisors or employees promoted to a supervisory position must receive the training within six months of their hire or assumption of the supervisory position. Compliance with this law does not insulate the district from any liability for harassment.

Note: Governing Board members, as elected officials, are not usually considered "supervisors"; however, since Board members have the authority to hire, reward, or discipline the Superintendent and other employees, Board members may also be required to receive sexual harassment training. Districts should consult with legal counsel to ensure that the appropriate individuals receive training.

Note: Although the law does not require districts with fewer than 50 employees to provide sexual harassment training to supervisors, court decisions have held that providing training may help mitigate damages in sexual harassment lawsuits. The provision of supervisor training may also be a factor in determining whether a district has taken reasonable steps to prevent discrimination and harassment pursuant to Government Code 12940. Therefore, it is recommended that all districts, regardless of the number of employees, provide sexual harassment training. Districts with fewer than 50 employees that do not provide sexual harassment training may revise the remainder of this section to reflect district practice.

Every two years, the Superintendent or designee shall ensure that supervisory employees receive at least two hours of classroom or other effective interactive training and education regarding sexual harassment. All such newly hired or promoted employees shall receive training within six months of their assumption of the new position. (Government Code 12950.1)

A supervisory employee is any employee having the authority, in the interest of the district, to hire, transfer, suspend, lay off, promote, discharge, assign, reward, or discipline other employees, or the responsibility to direct them, adjust their grievances, or effectively recommend such action, when the exercise of the authority is not of a merely routine or clerical nature, but requires the use of independent judgment. (Government Code 12926)

(cf. 4300 - Administrative and Supervisory Personnel)

Note: Government Code 12950.1 and 2 CCR 11024 require that the training for supervisory employees contain specified components and be presented by trainers or educators with knowledge and expertise in the prevention of harassment, discrimination, and retaliation.

The district's sexual harassment training and education program for supervisory employees shall be aimed at

assisting them in preventing and effectively responding to incidents of sexual harassment, as well as implementing mechanisms to promptly address and correct wrongful behavior. The training shall include, but is not limited to, the following: (Government Code 12950.1; 2 CCR 11024)

- 1. Information and practical guidance regarding federal and state laws on the prohibition, prevention, and correction of sexual harassment, the remedies available to sexual harassment victims in civil actions, and potential district and/or individual exposure or liability
- 2. The types of conduct that constitute sexual harassment and practical examples which illustrate sexual harassment, discrimination, and retaliation using training modalities such as role plays, case studies, and group discussions, based on factual scenarios taken from case law, news and media accounts, and hypotheticals based on workplace situations and other sources
- 3. A supervisor's obligation to report sexual harassment, discrimination, and retaliation of which he/she becomes aware and what to do if the supervisor himself/herself is personally accused of harassment
- 4. Strategies for preventing harassment, discrimination, and retaliation and appropriate steps to ensure that remedial measures are taken to correct harassing behavior, including an effective process for investigation of a complaint
- 5. The essential elements of the district's anti-harassment policy, including the limited confidentiality of the complaint process and resources for victims of unlawful sexual harassment, such as to whom they should report any alleged sexual harassment, and how to use the policy if a harassment complaint is filed
- 6. A copy of the district's sexual harassment policy and administrative regulation, which each participant shall acknowledge in writing that he/she has received
- 7. The definition and prevention of abusive conduct that addresses the use of derogatory remarks, insults, or epithets, other verbal or physical conduct that a reasonable person would find threatening, intimidating, or humiliating, and the gratuitous sabotage or undermining of a person's work performance

Note: Item #8 below is required pursuant to Government Code 12950.1, as amended by SB 396 (Ch. 858, Statutes of 2017).

8. Practical examples of harassment based on gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation

The Superintendent or designee shall retain for at least two years the records of any training provided to supervisory employees. Such records shall include the names of trained employees, date of the training, the type of training, and the name of the training provider. (2 CCR 11024)

Notifications

Note: Education Code 231.5 requires that the district provide copies of its policy on sexual harassment to staff, as specified below. In addition, 2 CCR 11024 requires that supervisory employees undergoing mandatory training receive a copy of the district's policy and acknowledge receipt of the policy; see item #6 in the section "Training" above.

A copy of the Board policy and this administrative regulation shall: (Education Code 231.5)

- 1. Be displayed in a prominent location in the main administrative building, district office, or other area of the school where notices of district rules, regulations, procedures, and standards of conduct are posted
- 2. Be provided to every district employee at the beginning of the first quarter or semester of the school year or whenever a new employee is hired

3. Appear in any school or district publication that sets forth the school's or district's comprehensive rules, regulations, procedures, and standards of conduct

Note: Government Code 12950 requires the Department of Fair Employment and Housing (DFEH) to develop an information sheet on employment discrimination and the illegality of sexual harassment. This document is available on DFEH's web site.

All employees shall receive a copy of an information sheet prepared by the California Department of Fair Employment and Housing (DFEH) or the district that contains, at a minimum, components on: (Government Code 12950)

- 1. The illegality of sexual harassment
- 2. The definition of sexual harassment under applicable state and federal law
- 3. A description of sexual harassment, with examples
- 4. The district's complaint process available to the employee
- 5. The legal remedies and complaint process available through DFEH and the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC)
- 6. Directions on how to contact DFEH and the EEOC
- 7. The protection against retaliation provided by 2 CCR 11021 for opposing harassment prohibited by law or for filing a complaint with or otherwise participating in an investigation, proceeding, or hearing conducted by DFEH and the EEOC

Note: Government Code 12950, as amended by SB 396 (Ch. 858, Statutes of 2017), requires districts to post, in a prominent and accessible location, a poster developed by DFEH regarding transgender rights. This poster is available on DFEH's web site.

In addition, the district shall post, in a prominent and accessible location, the DFEH poster on discrimination in employment and the illegality of sexual harassment and the DFEH poster regarding transgender rights. (Government Code 12950)

Sexual Harassment

Note: Education Code 231.5 mandates the district to have a written policy on sexual harassment. As part of this mandate, the district also should adopt a sexual harassment policy related to students; see BP/AR 5145.7 - Sexual Harassment.

Note: Sexual harassment is prohibited pursuant to Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 USC 2000e-2000e-17) and/or Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (20 USC 1681-1688), as well as the California Fair Employment and Housing Act (Government Code 12900-12996).

Note: Pursuant to Government Code 12940, employers may be held liable for sexual harassment committed against their workers by clients, customers, or other third parties if they knew or should have known of the harassment and failed to take immediate and appropriate corrective action to stop the harassment.

The Governing Board is committed to providing a safe work environment that is free of harassment and intimidation. The Board prohibits sexual harassment against district employees and retaliatory behavior or action against any person who complains, testifies, or otherwise participates in the complaint process established for the purpose of this policy.

Sexual Harassment

Note: The following administrative regulation is mandated pursuant to Education Code 231.5 and includes reasonable steps for preventing the occurrence of discrimination and harassment as required pursuant to Government Code 12940 (California Fair Employment and Housing Act). The focus of this administrative regulation is on sexual harassment by and of employees. Pursuant to Government Code 12940 and 2 CCR 11009, interns, volunteers, and job applicants are entitled to the same protection against sexual harassment as applicable to employees.

Note: For information related to sexual harassment involving students, see BP/AR 5145.7 - Sexual Harassment.

This administrative regulation shall apply to all allegations of sexual harassment involving employees, interns, volunteers, and job applicants, but shall not be used to resolve any complaint by or against a student.

Definitions

Note: In Oncale v. Sundowner Offshore Services, Inc., the U.S. Supreme Court held that same-sex sexual harassment could be actionable under Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 USC 2000e-2000e-17).

Prohibited sexual harassment includes, but is not limited to, unwelcome sexual advances, unwanted requests for sexual favors, or other unwanted verbal, visual, or physical conduct of a sexual nature made against another person of the same or opposite sex in the work or educational setting when: (Education Code 212.5; Government Code 12940; 2 CCR 11034)

- 1. Submission to the conduct is made explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of the individual's employment.
- 2. Submission to or rejection of the conduct is used as the basis for an employment decision affecting the individual.
- 3. Submission to or rejection of the conduct is used as the basis for any decision affecting the individual regarding benefits, services, honors, programs, or activities available at or through the district.

Note: Pursuant to Government Code 12940, conduct may meet the definition of sexual harassment regardless of whether or not the alleged harasser is motivated by sexual desire for the victim.

Prohibited sexual harassment also includes conduct which, regardless of whether or not it is motivated by sexual desire, is so severe or pervasive as to unreasonably interfere with the victim's work performance or create an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work environment.

Note: Pursuant to Government Code 12940, the district may be held liable for sexual harassment committed against employees by clients, customers, or other third parties if the district knew, or should have known, of the harassment and failed to take immediate and appropriate corrective

action to stop the harassment. The following paragraph clarifies that sexual harassment may include acts by supervisors, co-workers, or other parties and should be modified to reflect district practice.

Examples of actions that might constitute sexual harassment in the work or educational setting, whether committed by a supervisor, a co-worker, or a non-employee, include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Unwelcome verbal conduct such as sexual flirtations or propositions; graphic comments about an individual's body; overly personal conversations or pressure for sexual activity; sexual jokes or stories; unwelcome sexual slurs, epithets, threats, innuendoes, derogatory comments, sexually degrading descriptions, or the spreading of sexual rumors
- 2. Unwelcome visual conduct such as drawings, pictures, graffiti, or gestures; sexually explicit emails; displaying sexually suggestive objects
- 3. Unwelcome physical conduct such as massaging, grabbing, fondling, stroking, or brushing the body; touching an individual's body or clothes in a sexual way; cornering, blocking, leaning over, or impeding normal movements

Training

Note: The following paragraph is consistent with a district's affirmative duty to protect its employees from sex discrimination, including sexual harassment, pursuant to 2 CCR 11023. In its informal guidance, Promising Practices for Preventing Harassment, the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission recommends that employers provide sexual harassment training to all employees, not just supervisors and managers. In addition, since BP/AR 5145.7 - Sexual Harassment requires employees to report sexual harassment against students, training employees to recognize and address sexual harassment incidents furthers the district's interest in protecting both employees and students against prohibited conduct. Thus, it is strongly recommended that districts periodically provide sexual harassment training or information to all their employees, especially those who work at school sites.

Note: Provision of periodic training to all district employees could also help foster a positive work environment and mitigate damages against a district in the event of sexual harassment litigation. In Department of Health Services v. Superior Court (McGinnis), the California Supreme Court held that employers that have taken reasonable steps to prevent and correct workplace sexual harassment may be able to reduce damages in the event of a lawsuit. Such steps may include establishing anti-harassment policies and communicating those policies to employees.

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all employees receive training regarding the district's sexual harassment policies when hired and periodically thereafter. The training shall include how to recognize prohibited or harassing conduct, the procedures for reporting and/or filing complaints involving an employee, employees' duty to use the district's complaint procedures, and employee obligations when a sexual harassment report involving a student is made to the employee. The training shall also include information about processes for employees to informally share or obtain information about harassment without filing a complaint.

(cf. 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures)

(cf. 4030 - Nondiscrimination in Employment)

(cf. 5145.7 - Sexual Harassment)

Note: Government Code 12950.1 requires districts with 50 or more employees to provide two hours of sexual harassment training and education once every two years to every supervisory employee, defined as any employee with the authority to take employment action, including hiring, transferring, suspending, and disciplining other employees, or recommend such action if the exercise of that authority is not merely routine or clerical in nature. All newly hired supervisors or employees promoted to a supervisory position must receive the training within six months of their hire or assumption of the supervisory position. Compliance with this law does not insulate the district from any liability for harassment.

Note: Governing Board members, as elected officials, are not usually considered "supervisors"; however, since Board members have the authority to hire, reward, or discipline the Superintendent and other employees, Board members may also be required to receive sexual harassment training. Districts should consult with legal counsel to ensure that the appropriate individuals receive training.

Note: Although the law does not require districts with fewer than 50 employees to provide sexual harassment training to supervisors, court decisions have held that providing training may help mitigate damages in sexual harassment lawsuits. The provision of supervisor training may also be a factor in determining whether a district has taken reasonable steps to prevent discrimination and harassment pursuant to Government Code 12940. Therefore, it is recommended that all districts, regardless of the number of employees, provide sexual harassment training. Districts with fewer than 50 employees that do not provide sexual harassment training may revise the remainder of this section to reflect district practice.

Every two years, the Superintendent or designee shall ensure that supervisory employees receive at least two hours of classroom or other effective interactive training and education regarding sexual harassment. All such newly hired or promoted employees shall receive training within six months of their assumption of the new position. (Government Code 12950.1)

A supervisory employee is any employee having the authority, in the interest of the district, to hire, transfer, suspend, lay off, promote, discharge, assign, reward, or discipline other employees, or the responsibility to direct them, adjust their grievances, or effectively recommend such action, when the exercise of the authority is not of a merely routine or clerical nature, but requires the use of independent judgment. (Government Code 12926)

(cf. 4300 - Administrative and Supervisory Personnel)

Note: Government Code 12950.1 and 2 CCR 11024 require that the training for supervisory employees contain specified components and be presented by trainers or educators with knowledge and expertise in the prevention of harassment, discrimination, and retaliation.

The district's sexual harassment training and education program for supervisory employees shall be aimed at

assisting them in preventing and effectively responding to incidents of sexual harassment, as well as implementing mechanisms to promptly address and correct wrongful behavior. The training shall include, but is not limited to, the following: (Government Code 12950.1; 2 CCR 11024)

- 1. Information and practical guidance regarding federal and state laws on the prohibition, prevention, and correction of sexual harassment, the remedies available to sexual harassment victims in civil actions, and potential district and/or individual exposure or liability
- 2. The types of conduct that constitute sexual harassment and practical examples which illustrate sexual harassment, discrimination, and retaliation using training modalities such as role plays, case studies, and group discussions, based on factual scenarios taken from case law, news and media accounts, and hypotheticals based on workplace situations and other sources
- 3. A supervisor's obligation to report sexual harassment, discrimination, and retaliation of which he/she becomes aware and what to do if the supervisor himself/herself is personally accused of harassment
- 4. Strategies for preventing harassment, discrimination, and retaliation and appropriate steps to ensure that remedial measures are taken to correct harassing behavior, including an effective process for investigation of a complaint
- 5. The essential elements of the district's anti-harassment policy, including the limited confidentiality of the complaint process and resources for victims of unlawful sexual harassment, such as to whom they should report any alleged sexual harassment, and how to use the policy if a harassment complaint is filed
- 6. A copy of the district's sexual harassment policy and administrative regulation, which each participant shall acknowledge in writing that he/she has received
- 7. The definition and prevention of abusive conduct that addresses the use of derogatory remarks, insults, or epithets, other verbal or physical conduct that a reasonable person would find threatening, intimidating, or humiliating, and the gratuitous sabotage or undermining of a person's work performance

Note: Item #8 below is required pursuant to Government Code 12950.1, as amended by SB 396 (Ch. 858, Statutes of 2017).

8. Practical examples of harassment based on gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation

The Superintendent or designee shall retain for at least two years the records of any training provided to supervisory employees. Such records shall include the names of trained employees, date of the training, the type of training, and the name of the training provider. (2 CCR 11024)

Notifications

Note: Education Code 231.5 requires that the district provide copies of its policy on sexual harassment to staff, as specified below. In addition, 2 CCR 11024 requires that supervisory employees undergoing mandatory training receive a copy of the district's policy and acknowledge receipt of the policy; see item #6 in the section "Training" above.

A copy of the Board policy and this administrative regulation shall: (Education Code 231.5)

- 1. Be displayed in a prominent location in the main administrative building, district office, or other area of the school where notices of district rules, regulations, procedures, and standards of conduct are posted
- 2. Be provided to every district employee at the beginning of the first quarter or semester of the school year or whenever a new employee is hired
- (cf. 4112.9/4212.9/4312.9 Employee Notifications)
- 3. Appear in any school or district publication that sets forth the school's or district's comprehensive rules, regulations, procedures, and standards of conduct

Note: Government Code 12950 requires the Department of Fair Employment and Housing (DFEH) to develop an information sheet on employment discrimination and the illegality of sexual harassment. This document is available on DFEH's web site.

All employees shall receive a copy of an information sheet prepared by the California Department of Fair Employment and Housing (DFEH) or the district that contains, at a minimum, components on: (Government Code 12950)

- 1. The illegality of sexual harassment
- 2. The definition of sexual harassment under applicable state and federal law
- 3. A description of sexual harassment, with examples
- 4. The district's complaint process available to the employee
- 5. The legal remedies and complaint process available through DFEH and the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC)
- 6. Directions on how to contact DFEH and the EEOC
- 7. The protection against retaliation provided by 2 CCR 11021 for opposing harassment prohibited by law or for filing a complaint with or otherwise participating in an investigation, proceeding, or hearing conducted by DFEH and the EEOC

Note: Government Code 12950, as amended by SB 396 (Ch. 858, Statutes of 2017), requires districts to post, in a prominent and accessible location, a poster developed by DFEH regarding transgender rights. This poster is available on DFEH's web site.

In addition, the district shall post, in a prominent and accessible location, the DFEH poster on discrimination in employment and the illegality of sexual harassment and the DFEH poster regarding transgender rights. (Government Code 12950)

Note: Descriptions below identify revisions made to CSBA's sample board policies, administrative regulations, board bylaws, and/or exhibits. Editorial changes have also been made. Districts and county offices of education should review the sample materials and modify their own policies accordingly.

Uniform Complaint Procedures

(BP/AR revised) Policy updated to list all state and federal programs subject to the uniform complaint procedures (UCP) as specified in the Federal Program Monitoring instrument, reflect NEW LAW (AB 699) which includes immigration status as a prohibited basis for discrimination, and reflect NEW LAW (AB 365) which authorizes the use of UCP for alleged noncompliance with certain educational rights of children of military families. Policy also revised to clarify that, although complaints of employment discrimination are not subject to UCP, the district has an obligation to investigate such complaints using other district procedures. Regulation updated to reflect a requirement in AB 365 that the annual UCP notice include the educational rights of children of military families. Regulation also clarifies that any individual, public agency, or organization may file a complaint alleging violation of law regarding applicable state or federal programs, and deletes references to Office of Civil Rights resources on sexual violence which have been withdrawn.

Federal Grant Funds

(AR revised) Regulation updated to clarify that any federal formula or discretionary grant funds awarded to the district, including a federally funded child nutrition program according to NEW LAW (SB 544), must comply with the federal Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards. Regulation also reflects NEW FEDERAL REGULATION (82 Fed. Reg. 22609) which delays, until July 1, 2018, the date by which districts must comply with the procurement standards in the Uniform Guidance.

Integrated Pest Management

(AR revised) Regulation updated to clarify the applicability of integrated pest management requirements to child care facilities, delete an outdated date by which the annual training requirement became effective, and add requirement for pesticide-specific training. Regulation also reflects NEW STATE REGULATION (Register 2017, No. 45) which prohibits growers from making certain agricultural pesticide applications within one-quarter mile of a school site between 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. on weekdays and requires such growers to annually notify the principal regarding pesticides it expects to use during the year. See AR 3514.2

Food Service Operations/Cafeteria Fund

(BP/AR revised) Policy updated to reflect NEW LAW (SB 250) which requires districts to make their meal charge policy public and ensure that students with unpaid meal fees are not shamed or treated differently than other students. Section on "Procurement of Foods, Equipment, and Supplies" reflects NEW LAW (SB 730) which requires the California Department of Education (CDE) to provide information about the Buy American provision, NEW LAW (AB 822) which requires a preference for California-grown agricultural products with specified exceptions, and NEW LAW (SB 544) which clarifies that procurements in federally funded nutrition programs are subject to the procurement standards of the federal Uniform Guidance. Regulation updated to reflect provisions of SB 250 which require districts to notify parents/guardians within 10 days of a negative balance in their child's school meal account and to exhaust all options to enroll the student in the free and reduced-price meal program if he/she is eligible. Regulation also adds new section reflecting NEW LAW (SB 557) which authorizes donation of unused, unopened foods to a food bank or other nonprofit charitable organization.

Free and Reduced Price Meals

(BP/AR revised) Policy updated to reflect NEW LAW (SB 138) which requires districts to apply by September 1, 2018, for a federal universal meal service for "very high poverty schools," as defined, for the purpose of providing breakfast and/or lunch free of charge to all students enrolled at the school. An exception

exists for districts whose board adopts a resolution stating the district is unable to comply due to fiscal hardship. Regulation updated to reflect a provision of SB 138 which requires direct certification of students' eligibility for free or reduced-price meals based on their Medi-Cal participation. In both BP and AR, section related to confidentiality and allowable purposes for sharing students' free and reduced-price meal eligibility information revised to reflect the elimination of Title I program improvement.

Recruitment and Selection

(BP revised) Policy updated to expand discussion of possible recruitment incentives, including subsidized housing programs for teachers and other employees and NEW LAW (AB 99) which establishes the California Educator Development grant program to assist districts with attracting and supporting the preparation and continued learning of teachers, principals, and other school leaders. Policy also reflects NEW LAW (AB 168) which prohibits districts from seeking salary history information about an applicant and from relying on salary history information as a factor in determining whether to offer employment or the salary to offer an applicant, unless the salary information is disclosable under state or federal law or the applicant voluntarily discloses the information without prompting.

Sexual Harassment

(BP/AR revised) Policy updated to provide a strong statement of the board's commitment to provide a safe work environment that is free of sexual harassment and intimidation and to align the process for filing complaints of sexual harassment with AR 4030 - Nondiscrimination in Employment. Regulation updated to reflect NEW LAW (SB 396) which requires districts to post a Department of Fair Employment and Housing poster on transgender rights and, if the district has 50 or more employees, to provide training to supervisors regarding harassment based on gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation.

Personal Illness/Injury Leave

(AR revised) Regulation updated to reflect NEW LAW (SB 63) which extends the requirement to grant parental leave to an eligible employee for the purpose of bonding with a child after the birth, adoption, or foster care placement of the child to any district that employs 20-49 employees within 75 miles of the worksite where the employee requesting the leave is employed. Regulation also updated to reflect NEW LAW (SB 731) which entitles an employee who is a military veteran or current member of the California National Guard or federal reserve component to 10 days of additional sick leave for the purpose of undergoing medical treatment for a qualifying military service-connected disability, effective on either the date the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs rates the employee's disability or on the first day the employee begins or returns to employment after active duty, whichever is later.

Family Care and Medical Leave

(AR revised) Regulation updated to reflect NEW LAW (AB 1556) which deletes gender-specific references with regard to pregnancy disability leave and clarifies that all employees are protected against pregnancy discrimination regardless of their gender identity. Regulation also reflects NEW LAW (SB 63) which extends the requirement to grant parental leave to any district that employs 20-49 employees within 75 miles of the worksite where the employee requesting the leave is employed.

Personal Illness/Injury Leave

(AR revised) Regulation updated to reflect NEW LAW (SB 63) which extends the requirement to grant parental leave to any district that employs 20-49 employees within 75 miles of the worksite where the employee requesting the leave is employed. Regulation also updated to reflect NEW LAW (SB 731) which entitles an employee who is a military veteran or current member of the California National Guard or federal reserve component to 12 days of additional sick leave for the purpose of undergoing medical treatment for a qualifying military service-connected disability, effective on either the date the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs rates the employee's disability or on the first day the employee begins or returns to employment after active duty, whichever is later. See AR 4261.1

Student and Family Privacy Rights

(BP/AR revised) Policy updated to add options formerly in AR regarding the disclosure of students' personal information for marketing purposes. Policy also reflects state law which prohibits the collection of social security numbers or the last four digits of social security numbers for such purposes and NEW LAW (AB 699) which prohibits the collection of information regarding the citizenship or immigration status of students or their families. Regulation reflects NEW LAW (AB 677) which prohibits the removal of questions pertaining to sexual orientation and/or gender identity from a voluntary survey that already contains such questions.

Parental Notifications

(BP/E revised) Policy updated to reflect federal law applicable to districts participating in certain federal programs which requires that parental notifications be presented in an understandable and uniform format and, to the extent practicable, in a language that parents/guardians can understand. Policy also revised to reflect state law requiring that parental notifications be written in the primary language, in addition to English, whenever 15 percent or more of the students enrolled in a school speak a single primary language other than English. Exhibit updated to reflect notices required by NEW LAW, including notices related to students' right to a free public education regardless of immigration status or religious beliefs (AB 699), the employee code of conduct related to employee interactions with students (AB 500), the district's meal payment policy (USDA Memorandum SP-23-2017), a student's identification as a long-term English learner (AB 81), a negative balance in a student's meal account (SB 250), educational rights of children of military families (AB 365), and any excessive level of lead found in drinking water (AB 746). Title I Programs

(BP revised) Policy updated to address (1) the requirement to use federal Title I funds to supplement, not supplant, funds available from state and local sources; (2) use of the district's local control and accountability plan to fulfill requirements for the Title I local educational agency plan; and (3) methods for demonstrating the comparability of services between Title I and non-Title I schools. Regulation updated to reflect amendments by the Every Student Succeeds Act related to schoolwide programs, targeted assistance programs, and participation by private school students.

PROJECT PROPOSAL

Based on the construction plans, specifications and project schedule provided by AXIA Architects for the Phase 3 Multipurpose Room Modernization project, I.A Kuster (IOR) proposes the following to Gravenstein Union School District (GUSD):

DSA Project inspection services as set forth in DSA IR A-8 and RFP from AXIA Architects at a maximum of 15 hours per week for the duration of the project and on an as-needed basis for completion of the project if the time for completion should extend past the scheduled date of August 15th, 2018.

Each required site visit for inspections, meetings and/or coordination with the lab of record or other GUSD consultants will be a 3-hour minimum charge. IOR's fee structure is attached on the following page.

The project schedule provided calls for the project to begin May 1st and be substantially complete by August 15th (16 weeks). 15 hours per week at 16 weeks is 240 hours. IOR proposes an additional 20 hours for project closeout in the likely event that finalization of the project will extend past August 15th.

FEES

Hourly rates for DSA inspection services are listed below based on inspector class and project class. Please note that specific project fee amounts for individual projects will be based on the number of hours per week required by DSA for the duration of the project. 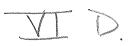

STREAM Lab Proposal

Spring 2018

Introduction

The Hillcrest principal and staff propose that the current computer lab in room 5 be reimagined into a 21st century learning environment called the STREAM Lab. STREAM is an acronym that stands for Science, Technology, Reading, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics. The STREAM Lab is influenced by the "Maker Movement," where students have opportunities to construct knowledge and develop understanding through hands-on activities that allow for true inquiry. The scope and physical footprint of the current computer lab will be increased to support 21st century learning experiences and the implementation of a STEAM model at Hillcrest. The STREAM Lab will include a book lending library and reading area, digital fabrication equipment, a digital media studio, space dedicated to hands-on activities, and a combination of desktop, laptop and tablet computing devices.

Why a STREAM Lab?

Hillcrest Middle School

There are three main factors that justify the need for Hillcrest to develop a STREAM Lab:

- 1. Hillcrest has not offered a central book lending library with a dedicated reading space for over 10 years, and the STREAM Lab would include this element. Contemporary libraries have moved toward providing young people with opportunities to interact with information in a wide variety of ways. Youth sections in public libraries in San Francisco, Chicago, and even Sebastopol are not only offering books, periodicals and digital reference subscriptions, they are including MakerSpaces, digital media equipment, and more. At local schools, the Sonoma State Information Center recently opened a dedicated MakerSpace, and the library at Kenilworth Junior High has include a MakerSpace for three years. At Union School District in Silicon Valley, where a STEAM program has been implemented K-8, all libraries have been converted into spaces like the proposed STREAM Lab. In developing a STREAM Lab, Hillcrest will be on the cutting edge of libraries and 21st century learning spaces.
- 2. Hillcrest offers a one-to-one Chromebook program, where students have access to Chromebooks in their classrooms. A traditional computer lab, consisting only of desktop computers, offers very little beyond the Chromebooks available in classrooms. The STREAM Lab would include computers, and new technological devices that would provide students opportunities beyond what is available on their Chromebooks. Digital fabrication equipment would be available, so that students can learn to create and prototype 2D and 3D objects through computer controlled 3D printing and a 2D laser cutting. Hardware to support learning in the area of

computer programming, like micro:bits and Arduinos, will be available in the STREAM Lab. Lastly, digital media equipment such as a video studio, including cameras, lighting, green screen and digital video editing stations will also be included in the lab. These more robust learning opportunities in the area of technology will further establish Hillcrest as a 21st century learning environment.

3. In 2018-19, Hillcrest 6th grade will be piloting a STEAM instructional model with weekly hands-on activities that integrate Science, Technology, Arts and Mathematics. The STREAM Lab will provide a dedicated space for these activities, and specialized equipment that will allow these activities more depth and complexity. These hands-on activities won't always be facilitated in the STREAM Lab, but this space will certainly be an asset to the STEAM instructional model.

How will the STREAM Lab be used?

The STREAM Lab will be used in the following ways:

- The Hillcrest technology teacher, and possibly others, will teach elective and enrichment classes in the STREAM Lab.
- Teachers will be able to sign-up to bring their students to the STREAM Lab to work on projects or check out books.
- The STREAM Lab will be open for students during some lunches and some days after-school, so that they can work on projects, read, or check out books.
- The Hillcrest TV show will be produced in the STREAM Lab.

How will the STREAM Lab be staffed?

The Hillcrest technology teacher will be the lead steward of the STREAM lab and will not only teach classes in the lab, but the teacher's schedule will be designed to provide support/guidance in the lab to teachers and students during particular class, lunch and after-school periods.

Current Hillcrest classified staff will be utilized to help maintain the book lending library, and may also work in the library section to check books in and out.

Additional staffing is not anticipated at this point.

STREAM Lab Concept Development

The following activities have supported the development of the STREAM Lab concept:

- Hillcrest principal and technology teacher visited MakerSpaces at Sonoma State, Analy High School, and SCOE.
- SCOE 21st Century Learning Specialists visited Hillcrest to provide guidance on the concept.

- SCOE Library Specialist visited Hillcrest to provide guidance and assess current book collection.
- Hillcrest principal and teacher-in-charge attended California STEAM Symposium sessions on establishing learning spaces to support STEAM learning.
- Hillcrest staff attended a hands-on learning session at the SCOE MakerSpace.

Overview

It is proposed that the conversion of the current Hillcrest computer lab into the STREAM Lab occur over three phases, beginning in Summer 2018. Here is a general overview of items to be included in each phase:

Phase I

- Increase physical footprint of the lab by combining rooms 5 and 6
- Relocate electrical/data conduit from wall to ceiling drop points
- Establish book lending library and reading space
- Acquire and install 5, 3D printers
- Acquire and install computer controlled laser cutter (1)
- Set up digital media studio (with Innovations Grant equipment)
- Refresh 15 desktop computers with a combination of desktop, laptop and tablet computing devices
- Acquire class set of micro bit devices (computer programming hardware)
- Add casters to half of the existing tables
- Install table(s) suited for hands-on activities
- Acquire supplies for hands-on engineering, science, math and art activities
- Acquire storage containers to store hands-on supplies, using in existing shelving

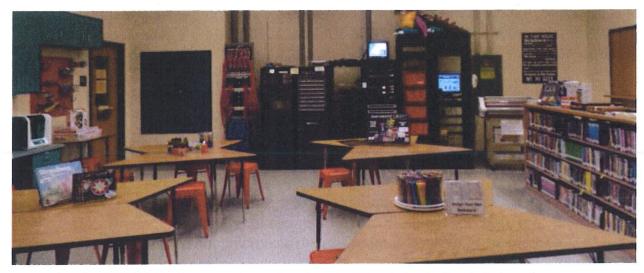
Phase 2

- Acquire additional books for lending library
- Refresh 15 remaining desktop computers with a combination of 15 desktop,
 laptop and tablet computing devices
- Acquire and install 5 additional 3D printers
- Acquire class set of robotics equipment (15 kits)
- Acquire supplies for hands-on engineering, science, math and art activities
- Replace carpet with tile
- Replace current chairs with updated seating that is more modular
- Acquire additional cameras and audio equipment for media studio
- Acquire hardware for music production



Phase 3

- Acquire additional books for lending library
- Acquire and install computer controlled vinyl cutter
- Acquire and install heat press (used to create shirts with vinyl cutter)
- Acquire supplies for hands-on engineering, science, math and art activities
- Acquire equipment for live broadcasting
- Replace furniture as needed

Phase I Details

It is proposed that Phase I occur during the summer of 2018, so that the STREAM Lab can be open to students in the fall of 2018. Each item listed for Phase I in the overview will be explained in detail below, with estimated associated costs.

Increase physical footprint of the lab by combining rooms 5 and 6

It is proposed that rooms 5 and 6 by combined, so that the STREAM lab will be the size of two standard classrooms. Room 5 at Hillcrest is currently a traditional computer lab with 32 HP desktop computers. Room 6 is a standard classroom next door to room 5. The two rooms are separated by one modular wall that was originally built with hinges to open and close. During modernizations over the past 15 years, HVAC ventilation was installed close to the wall, and electrical/data conduit was installed on the wall, preventing it from being opened and closed freely.

After the addition of new science and performing arts classrooms to Hillcrest in 2016, Hillcrest currently has one more classroom than needed, allowing for room 6 to be combined with room 5, without impacting the school's use schedule. Even with future



enrollment projected to grow, this additional classroom is not needed. A footprint larger than a typical classroom is needed for the STREAM Lab in order to have ample space for a book lending library and reading area, digital fabrication equipment, a digital media studio, space dedicated to hands-on activities, and a combination of desktop, laptop and tablet computing devices. Consultants from SCOE, specializing in 21st century learning and libraries, visited the classrooms and agreed that combining the two classrooms would provide an optimal size for the lab.

The wall between the two rooms can be removed by the GUSD maintenance department at no cost. The wall removal will not impact the HVAC ventilation, but will require relocating the electrical/data conduit. The wall is divided into panels, and the two outer panels would remain in order to define spaces within the lab.

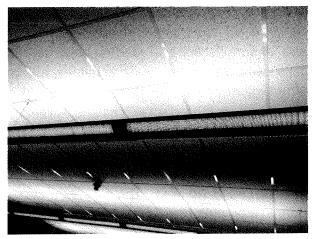

It is proposed that the electrical and data wiring currently located within the conduit on the wall to be removed, be relocated to ceiling drop points throughout the lab. Model labs located at SCOE, Analy High School, and Union School District (Silicon Valley) have implemented this approach, and it has proven successful. Retractable electrical and data connections descending from ceiling drops, allow for versatility and flexibility in the use of the lab. GUSD head of maintenance, Brian Sposato, recommends this approach and estimates the cost would not exceed \$8,000, when completed by an electrician.

Establish book lending library and reading space

It is proposed that the STREAM Lab offer a book lending library and a designated space for students to read. Hillcrest has not offered a central book lending library, or a designated place where students can read for over ten years. There is a book collection housed in the teacher work area behind the front office, but the collection has not been updated for as many years, and there is not a database of the collection, or system for students to check the books out. A central book lending library and reading space not only promotes literacy, but it encourages reading for pleasure and a lifelong love of learning.

In consultation with the library specialist from SCOE, the following steps have been identified to establish a book lending library and reading area at Hillcrest, putting the R into the STREAM lab:

- 1. Acquire and move necessary furniture into room 6. The existing shelving that houses the outdated book collection from the teacher work room is in excellent condition and can be moved into room 6 to house the updated collection. The shelving can be moved and installed by Hillcrest maintenance at no cost. For the reading area, new seating furniture is needed and estimated to cost no more than \$2,000.
- 2. Evaluate which books in the current collection should be kept, and move them into the STREAM Lab. The evaluation will be done with support from the SCOE library specialist. The SCOE library specialist anticipates that approximately 200 titles will be moved into the STREAM Lab.

- 3. Purchase the first phase of new books for the library. The SCOE library specialist recommends that a school the size of Hillcrest maintain a book collection of approximately 1,500 titles. With only 200 titles being kept from the current collection, that would result in 1,300 new titles. The average cost of shelf-ready processed books is approximately \$40, so 1,300 titles would cost \$52,000. It seems prudent to acquire new book titles incrementally, so it is proposed that 300 new titles be acquired in Phase I, with an estimated cost of \$12,000. These titles would be selected in consultation with Hillcrest staff and the SCOE library specialist.
- 4. Establish a database and system for checking out the books. According to the SCOE library specialist, the startup cost for a cloud-based database (excluding hardware) is approximately \$1,500, with an annual ongoing subscription cost of approximately \$800. The local hardware required is a barcode scanner and desktop computer, with an estimated total cost of \$800.

Acquire and install 5, 3D printers

It is proposed that 5, 3D printers be included in Phase I of the STREAM Lab. 3D printing technology allows students to create plastic objects that they have designed using 3D modeling software. 3D printers are common in MakerSpaces, and are present in the model labs that Hillcrest staff visited at SCOE, Analy, and Sonoma State. 3D printers take several hours to print an object, so it is recommended to have multiple printers in order to give multiple students access to printing each day. The printers use a plastic filament to print objects and only require two square feet of counter space. There is no exhaust from 3D printers, and they do not heat up significantly while printing. 3D printing technology can be used to support engineering, science, art, and math activities.

A variety of open source design and printing softwares are compatible with the proposed printer, and the printer can be controlled by standard Windows or Apple computers. There are a range of 3D printers available, but the SCOE Maker specialists recommend a model that costs \$350 (including tax and shipping). The plastic filament used for printing is relatively inexpensive; \$300 worth of filament should last for one year. The printers can be set up and installed by the Hillcrest technology instructor.

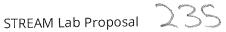

Acquire and install computer controlled laser cutter (1)

It is proposed that one computer controlled laser cutter be included in Phase I of the STREAM Lab. A computer controlled laser cutter will cut or etch two dimensional designs into/through, wood, cardboard, or glass. The device reads digital design (vector graphics) files that can be created through open source or proprietary (Adobe) software. The laser cutter does emit exhaust and would be placed on a counter near the window, so that the exhaust can be routed out the window. Laser cutters were present in the model labs visited by Hillcrest staff, where there were no windows available, and the exhaust was trapped by an exhaust system. The Hillcrest STREAM Lab has the benefit of ample counter space near windows, eliminating the need for an exhaust system. Flammable objects being cut/etched by the laser do have the potential of catching fire, so it is essential to have adult supervision when operating the laser cutter and to take all necessary safety precautions.



These devices have been used widely in other schools without incident, and come recommended by the SCOE Maker specialists. Unlike 3D printers, the laser cutter works fairly quickly, so items can be created within a class period. A key feature of the proposed laser cutter is a scanning feature, allowing objects to be created from hand-drawn designs. Laser cut objects can be used as components in 3D designs, as standalone objects, and support projects in engineering, science, art and math. The laser cutter can be set up and installed by Hillcrest staff.

Total Estimated Cost: \$7,900 (including tax and shipping)

Work to be completed by: Hillcrest Staff

Set up digital media studio (with Innovations Grant equipment)

Hillcrest was the recipient of an Innovations grant for \$2,400 through Innovate/Educate Sonoma, which funded the first phase of the digital media studio. The equipment has been purchased and is currently being utilized in the existing computer lab. This equipment includes a new iMac computer, DSLR camera, camcorder, microphones, green screen studio, and other accessories. Students will be producing a Hillcrest TV show in the spring of 2018 to share on the Hillcrest YouTube Channel.

Total Estimated Cost: \$0 [\$2,400 received from Innovations grant]

Refresh 15 desktop computers with a combination of desktop and laptop computing devices

It is proposed that 15 of the computers in the STREAM Lab be refreshed in Phase I. The Hillcrest computer lab currently contains 32 HP desktop computers running the Windows operating system. These computers were purchased in 2015, and at 3 years old, they are beginning to fail should and be refreshed over the next year or two. Furthermore, a traditional computer lab configuration of 32 desktop computers, side-by-side, limits the ability for student collaboration, an essential aspect of 21st century learning. By refreshing 15 of these desktop computers with mostly laptops, the technology portion of the STREAM lab will have more available space for collaboration and hands-on activities, *and* improved computing devices. The three proposed desktop computers are iMacs, similar to the computer acquired for the digital media studio, to increase opportunities for digital video and audio projects through the iLife software suite. Because the 2D and 3D applications for printing and laser cutting function on Chromebooks, and to align with the other devices on the Hillcrest campus, the remaining computers in this phase will be Chromebooks, to be stored in a charging cart. These new computing devices can be installed and maintained by the Hillcrest technology teacher.

Acquire class set of micro:bit devices (computer programming hardware)

It is proposed that a full class set of "micro:bits" be included in Phase I of the STREAM Lab. A micro:bit is a hardware item that connects to a Chromebook, PC, or Apple computer, and can be programmed with object oriented or code-based programming languages. This technology was explored by Hillcrest staff at a recent visit to the SCOE Lab and has an easy entry point, but can also accommodate complex applications. Paired with low voltage test leads, students can learn software and hardware programming in a fun and accessible format.

For optimal versatility, some tables in the STREAM lab will be retrofitted to have locking casters. The tables in the current computer lab already have threaded holes in their legs, so casters can be installed easily. This can be accomplished by GUSD Maintenance or Hillcrest staff.

Install table(s) suited for hands-on activities

Professional development for Hillcrest teachers on the specialized equipment in the STREAM Lab will be provided by the Hillcrest technology teacher. The Hillcrest technology teacher will attend monthly sessions at the SCOE MakerSpace, to better understand the equipment in the lab. This cost for this item is included in the previously approved STEAM instructional model pilot proposal.

The Beyond the Bell Program (before and after school care) is available at both campuses. TK/Kindergarten through 5th grade at Gravenstein and 6th through 8th grade at Hillcrest. We provide nutritious snacks, campus arts and crafts at Gravenstein and homework time and assistance at both campuses, outdoor sports /recreation as well as self-directed play.

Program Hours:

The Beyond the Bell Program operates on the school calendar and is not open during school holidays.

Registration and Enrollment

To reserve a space for your child, a nonrefundable check of **\$50.00** is due prior to the first day of requested attendance. A monthly contract must be completed to secure the days and times needed during the school year.

Prepaid Monthly Contracts for 2018-2019

The contracts remain in effect throughout the school year. With a minimum of two (2) weeks written notice, changes may be approved by the Beyond the Bell Program Director to begin the following month. There are no refunds or make up days for absences. This includes days that the school may close for reasons such as power outages, floods etc. We do not charge extra on minimum release days or charge less during months with vacation days.

Payment Policies

Once your Procare account has been set up you can make your payment at https://www.myprocare.com/ Swipe your Visa/Debit card at either site or you can make checks out to Gravenstein USD.

There will be a \$12.00 service charge on returned checks and the check will need to be replaced with cash or money order. We will not re-deposit checks. We reserve the right to discontinue service when payment is not made by the 10th of the month. If payment is late continuously we will terminate the contract and your child will not be allowed to attend Beyond the Bell. We send a courtesy invoice, but expect regularly monthly payments regardless of when invoice is received.

Late Pick-Up Policy

Please allow time to collect belongings, sign out, and say goodbye. The late fee is \$5.00 per minute. After 3 occurrences of picking up after 3:30/ 5:30 pm (according to your signed contract) at Gravenstein and 5:15 pm at Hillcrest, we reserve the right to discontinue service.

Arrival/Departures

State law requires parents/authorized persons to accompany children into the building to personally sign in and out daily. Only authorized individuals over the age of 18 may check students out.

Absentees

There are no refunds or make up days for absences of any kind.

Illness

Children in our care exhibiting signs of contagious illness such as an extremely runny nose, fever, diarrhea, vomiting etc., will require a parent or guardian to pick up the child as soon as possible.

Medications

The school office can only administer prescription medications in the original containers. The district provides an authorization form, which must accompany any over-the-counter or prescription medications and be accompanied by a signed physician's note indicating dates times and dosages needed.
